MONSOON 2018 DAILY SITUATION REPORT NO – 071

(PERIOD COVERED: 1300 HRS 2 September 2018 – 1300 HRS 3 September 2018)

1. **Rivers Flow Situation Reported by Flood Forecasting Division.** All major rivers are in the state of their **Normal Flows**. Details at **Annex A**.
2. **Past Meteorological Situation and Future Forecast by PMD.** Significant rainfall reported during last 24 hours: Kotli 59 mm and Malamjabba 46 mm. PMD forecast for next 24 hours predicts **“Light to moderate rainfall at scattered places is expected over Malakand, Hazara, Peshawar, Kohat, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala & D.G. Khan Divisions alongwith Upper Catchments of Rivers Indus, Jhelum and Chenab. Rain at a few places is also expected over Lahore & Sargodha Divisions alongwith Upper Catchments of Rivers Ravi and Sutlej”. Wet spell is likely to decrease.** Details at **Annex B**.

4. **Significant Events Last 24 Hours.** No significant event reported.
5. **Road Situation (NHA and Respective Provinces)**
 - a. Road to Batswat village, Tehsil Ishkoman, District Ghizer, GB is blocked due to debris flow. Work is in progress to restore the road by district administration.
 - b. **All other roads across the Country are clear.**
6. **Railway Situation.** All railway routes are clear.
7. **Preliminary Losses / Damages Reported.** Overall details of losses / damages during Monsoon Season 2018 are at **Annex C**.
8. **Relief Provided.** Overall details of relief provided at **Annex D**.
9. **Any Critical Activity to Report.** Nothing to Report.
10. **NDMA Recommendations.** In view of ongoing Monsoon spell and considering the weather forecast by PMD, relevant stakeholders are advised to remain on **Alert** and ensure following:-
 - a. **Timely clearance of sewerage / drainage system in all major cities including Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Faisalabad, Lahore, Multan & Peshawar by all stakeholders.**
 - b. Issuing Alert to people residing in / close to river plains / water courses.

- c. Raising awareness to public with regards to vacating dangerous buildings, remaining away from electric wires and avoid swimming during rain especially in underpasses.
- d. Advising vulnerable population not to venture Nullahs crossing/ likely flash flooding routes.
- e. NHA, FWO and C&W Department of respective Provinces / Regions may please remain ready for restoring road linkages.
- f. NIH / NHEPRN to advise all provincial Health departments about pre-placement of necessary staff and medicines where required.

PAST METEOROLOGICAL SITUATION AND FUTURE FORECAST BY PMD

1. **Significant Rainfall Reported Last 24 Hours**

- a. **Islamabad**. Saidpur 21 mm, Golra 18 mm, Zeropoint 13 mm, New Airport 6 mm, Old Airport 6 mm, Shamsabad 5 mm and Bokra 4 mm.
- b. **Balochistan**. Barkhan 7 mm.
- c. **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa**. Malamjabba 46 mm, Brarkot 16 mm, Tarbela 13 mm, Risalpur 13 mm, Kakul 11 mm, Besham 5 mm, Saidu Sharif 5 mm, Oghi 4 mm, Kohat 3 mm, Shinkiari 2 mm, Balakot 2 mm, Rashidabad (Kalpani) 1 mm, Dir 1 mm and Lower Dir 1 mm.
- d. **Punjab**. Kamra 20 mm, Murree 15 mm, D.G. Khan (Fort Munro) 10 mm, Lahore 10 mm, Chakwal 8 mm, Mangla 2 mm Gujranwala 2 mm and Zafarwal 1 mm.

2. **Weather Forecast Next 24 Hours.** ***Light to moderate rainfall at scattered places is expected over Malakand, Hazara, Peshawar, Kohat, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala & D.G. Khan Divisions alongwith Upper Catchments of Rivers Indus, Jhelum and Chenab. Rain at a few places is also expected over Lahore & Sargodha Divisions alongwith Upper Catchments of Rivers Ravi and Sutlej.***

3. **Rainfall Outlook from 4 September 2018 to 10 September 2018.** *No very heavy rainfall is expected during the period.*

4. **Catchments Forecast.** *No very heavy rainfall is expected during the period.*

5. **Weather Last 24 Hours.** Weather remained hot and humid in most parts of the Country. However, rain-thundershower occurred at isolated places in Malakand, Hazara, Peshawar, Rawalpindi, Lahore, Gujranwala, Zhob Divisions, Islamabad and Kashmir.
