**MONSOON 2018 DAILY SITUATION REPORT NO – 075**

**(PERIOD COVERED: 1300 HRS 6 September 2018 – 1300 HRS 7 September 2018)**

1. **Rivers Flow Situation Reported by Flood Forecasting Division.** All major rivers are in the state of their Normal Flows. **Flows are likely to increase in Rivers Jhelum & Chenab and associated Nullahs of Rivers Chenab & Ravi from 14 September 2018.** Details at Annex A.
2. **Past Meteorological Situation and Future Forecast by PMD.** No significant rainfall reported during last 24 hours. PMD forecast for next 24 hours predicts **“Scattered thunderstorm / rain with isolated heavy falls are expected over the Upper Catchments of all the major Rivers except River Indus alongwith Bannu, Kohat, Hazara, Rawalpindi & Gujranwala Divisions. Isolated rainfall is expected over the Upper Catchment of River Indus alongwith Malakand, Sargodha, Lahore & Bahawalpur Divisions and Southeast Sindh”.** Details at Annex B.

4. **Significant Events Last 24 Hours.** No significant event reported.
5. **Road Situation (NHA and Respective Provinces)**
  - a. KKH was blocked at Hassanabad, GB on 6 September 2018 for both way traffic by FWO.
  - b. Road to Batswat village, Tehsil Ishkoman, District Ghizer, GB is blocked due to debris flow. Work is in progress to restore the road by district administration.
  - c. **All other roads across the Country are clear.**
6. **Railway Situation.** All railway routes are clear.
7. **Preliminary Losses / Damages Reported.** Overall details of losses / damages during Monsoon Season 2018 are at Annex C.
8. **Relief Provided.** Overall details of relief provided at Annex D.
9. **Any Critical Activity to Report.** Nothing to Report.

10. **NDMA Recommendations.** In view of ongoing Monsoon spell and considering the weather forecast by PMD, relevant stakeholders are advised to remain on **Alert** and ensure following:-

- a. ***Timely clearance of sewerage / drainage system in all major cities including Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Faisalabad, Lahore, Multan & Peshawar by all stakeholders.***
- b. Issuing Alert to people residing in / close to river plains / water courses.
- c. Raising awareness to public with regards to vacating dangerous buildings, remaining away from electric wires and avoid swimming during rain especially in underpasses.
- d. Advising vulnerable population not to venture Nullahs crossing/ likely flash flooding routes.
- e. NHA, FWO and C&W Department of respective Provinces / Regions may please remain ready for restoring road linkages.
- f. NIH / NHEPRN to advise all provincial Health departments about pre-placement of necessary staff and medicines where required.

3. **Rainfall Outlook from 8 September 2018 to 14 September 2018. Sactred thunderstorm / rain with isolated heavy falls and one or two very heavy falls are expected over the upper parts of the Country from 13 September 2018.**
  
4. **Catchments Forecast**. Sactred thunderstorm / rain with isolated heavy falls and one or two very heavy falls are expected over the Upper Catchments of all the major Rivers except River Indus from 13 September 2018.
  
5. **Weather Last 24 Hours**. Weather remained hot and humid in most parts of the Country. However, light rain occurred at Gujranwala Division and Gilgit-Baltistan.
