MONSOON 2018 DAILY SITUATION REPORT NO – 005

(PERIOD COVERED: 1300 HRS 28 June 2018 – 1300 HRS 29 June 2018)

1. **Rivers Flow Situation Reported by Flood Forecasting Division.** River Kabul at Nowshera is in Low Flood level and all other major rivers are flowing at normal level. ***Nullahs of River Ravi and River Chenab may attain low to Medium level flooding during 29 to 30 June 2018.*** Details at Annex A.

2. **Past Meteorological Situation and Future Forecast by PMD.** Significant rainfall reported in last 24 hours: Sialkot 45 mm and Chhor 44 mm. PMD forecast for next 24 hours predicts ***Scattered thunderstorm/rain with isolated heavy falls is expected over Upper catchments of Rivers Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej along with Faisalabad, Gujranwala Lahore, Sahiwal and Bahawalpur Divisions and Southeast Sindh. Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over Malakand, Hazara & Rawalpindi Divisions along with Gilgit Baltistan & South Sindh.*** Details at Annex B.

5. **Road Situation (NHA and Respective Provinces).** All roads across the Country are clear.

6. **Railway Situation.** All railway routes are clear.

7. **Preliminary Losses / Damages Reported**

a. 1 x death, 1 x injured and 1 x house partially damage reported during last 24 hours.

8. **Relief Provided.** No relief provided till now.

9. **Any Critical Activity to Report.** Nothing to Report.

10. **NDMA Recommendations**

a. Timely clearance of sewerage / drainage system in all major cities including Rawalpindi, Lahore & Peshawar by all stakeholders.

b. Issuing Alert to people residing in / close to river plains / water courses.

c. Raising awareness to public with regards to vacating dangerous buildings, remaining away from electric wires and avoid swimming during rain especially in underpasses.

- d. Advising vulnerable population not to venture into nullahs / flash flooding routes.
- e. NHA, FWO and C&W Depts of respective Provinces / Regions may please remain vigilant in restoring road linkages.
- f. NIH / NHEPRN to advise all provincial Health departments about pre-placement of necessary staff and medicines where required.

2. **Weather Forecast Next 24 Hours**. Scattered thunderstorm / rain with isolated heavy falls is expected over Upper catchments of Rivers Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej along with Faisalabad, Gujranwala, Lahore, Sahiwal and Bahawalpur Divisions and Southeast Sindh. Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over Malakand, Hazara & Rawalpindi Divisions along with Gilgit Baltistan & South Sindh.

3. **Weather Outlook for 30 June 201 and 1 July 2018**. Wet spell is likely to decrease.

4. **Weather Last 24 Hours**. Rain-thundershower with gusty winds occurred at scattered places in Gujranawala, Lahore, Bhawalpur, Thatta, Hyderabad and Karachi Divisions, while at isolated places in Rawalpindi, Sarghodha Divisions and Gilgit-Baltistan. Weather remained hot and dry in other parts of the country.
