MONSOON 2018 DAILY SITUATION REPORT NO – 007

(PERIOD COVERED: 1300 HRS 30 June 2018 – 1300 HRS 1 July 2018)

1. **Rivers Flow Situation Reported by Flood Forecasting Division.** River Kabul at Nowshera is in Low Flood level and all other major rivers are flowing at normal level. Details at **Annex A.**

2. **Past Meteorological Situation and Future Forecast by PMD.** No significant rainfall reported during last 24 hours. PMD forecast for next 24 hours predicts *Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over Upper Catchments of Rivers Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej along with Faisalabad, Gujranwala Lahore, Sahiwal, Malakand, Hazara D.G Khan & Rawalpindi Divisions, Northeast Balochistan & Gilgit Baltistan.* Details at **Annex B.**

10. **NDMA Recommendations**

 - Issuing Alert to people residing in / close to river plains / water courses.
 - Raising awareness to public with regards to vacating dangerous buildings, remaining away from electric wires and avoid swimming during rain especially in underpasses.
 - Advising vulnerable population not to venture into nullahs / flash flooding routes.
 - NHA, FWO and C&W Depts of respective Provinces / Regions may please remain vigilant in restoring road linkages.
 - NIH / NHEPRN to advise all provincial Health departments about pre-placement of necessary staff and medicines where required.

Singh 10 mm, Bahawalnagar 9 mm, Alexandra Bridge 8 mm, Marala 7 mm, Ravi Syphon 6 mm, Kotnainan 5 mm, Sargodha 3 mm, Jhelum 3 mm, Shorkot 3 mm, Kasur 1 mm, Sialkot 1 mm, Mangla 1 mm and Mandibahauddin 1 mm.

2. **Weather Forecast Next 24 Hours**. Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over Upper Catchments of Rivers Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej along with Faisalabad, Gujranwala Lahore, Sahiwal, Malakand, Hazara D.G Khan & Rawalpindi Divisions, Northeast Balochistan & Gilgit Baltistan.

3. **Weather Outlook for 2 July 2018 and 3 July 2018**. Scattered wind thunderstorm/rain with isolated heavy falls is expected over Lahore, Faisalabad, Gujranwala, Rawalpindi, Sargodha & Sahiwal Divisions along with Upper Catchments of Rivers Indus, Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej from 2 July 2018.

4. **Weather Last 24 Hours**. Mainly hot and dry weather occurred in most parts of the Country. However, rain-thundershower with gusty winds occurred at isolated places in Gujranwala, Lahore, Faisalabad, Sargodha, Sahiwal, Bahawalpur, Mirpur khas, Makran Divisions and Kashmir.
