MONSOON 2017 DAILY SITUATION REPORT NO - 045

(Period Covered: 1300 hrs 14 August 2017 – 1300 hrs 15 August 2017)

- 1. <u>Rivers Flow Situation Reported by Flood Forecasting Division</u>. All rivers are flowing at Normal levels except; **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Taunsa, Guddu & Sukkur are at **Low Flood Level**. Details at **Annex A**.
- 2. <u>Past Meteorological Situation and Future Forecast by PMD</u>. No significant rainfall reported in last 24 hours. PMD forecast for next 24 hours predicts mainly dry weather in most parts of the Country. However, isolated thunderstorms / rains expected over Gilgit Baltistan & Kashmir Details at **Annex B**.

- 4. <u>Significant Events Last 24 Hours</u>. On 14 August 2017, in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa following damages and losses were reported due to thunderstorms / lightening:
 - a. 2 x Males died each in Districts Chitral and Shangla and 1 x Male injured in District Chitral.
 - b. 1 x Child and 1 x Female was injured in District Lakki Marwat.
- 5. Road Situation (NHA and Respective Provinces).
 - a. Efforts are being made to open **Hunza Shimshal Road.**
 - c. All others roads across the Country are clear for all types of traffic.
- 6. **Railway Situation**. All railway routes are clear.
- 7. <u>Preliminary Losses / Damages Reported</u>
 - a. 4 x Deaths & 3 x Injured were reported during last 24 hours.
 - b. Overall details of losses / damages during Monsoon Season 2017 are at **Annex C**.
- 8. Relief Provided. Overall details of relief provided at Annex D.
- 9. **Any Critical Activity to Report**. Nothing to Report.
- 10. **NDMA Recommendations**. Considering weather forecast by PMD, relevant stakeholders are advised to remain on **Alert** and ensure following:
 - a. Issue timely alerts to people residing in / close to river plains / water courses.

- b. Public awareness to vacate **dangerous buildings**, **kacha houses** during periods of intense rain and avoid venturing in flooded water channels.
- c. Monitoring of vulnerable flood protection structures to ward off any *Accidental Breaches*.
- d. **Tourists be cautioned** to avoid travelling to areas vulnerable to flash floods / landslides.
- e. Prudent placing and timely mobilization of earth moving machinery for restoration of road infrastructure.

PAST METEOROLOGICAL SITUATION AND FUTURE FORECAST BY PMD

- 1. Rainfall Reported Last 24 Hours
 - a. **Punjab**. D.G. Khan 5 mm and Marala 1 mm.
 - b. <u>Khyber Pakhtunkhwa</u>. Malamjabba 18 mm, Saidu Sharif 13 mm, Upper Dir 10 mm, Kalam 8 mm, Pattan 6 mm, Shinkiari 2 mm, Nowshera 1 mm and Talhatta 1 mm.
 - c. Balochistan. Barkhan 5 mm.
 - d. AJ&K. Hattian Bala 36 mm and Garhi Dupatta 3 mm.
 - e. <u>Gilgit Baltistan</u>. Hunza 19 mm, Bagrote 14 mm, Bunji 10 mm, Chilas 3 mm and Gupis 3 mm.
 - f. **FATA**. Parachinar 10 mm.
- 2. <u>Weather Forecast Next 24 Hours</u>. Mainly dry weather is expected over most parts of the country. However, isolated thunderstorms / rains expected over Gilgit Baltistan and Kashmir.
- 3. <u>Weather Last 24 Hours</u>. Weather remained hot and humid in most parts of the country. However, rains / thunderstorms occurred at isolated places in Malakand Division, FATA, Barkhan, Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan.
