**MONSOON 2017 DAILY SITUATION REPORT NO – 056**

**(Period Covered: 1300 hrs 25 August 2017 – 1300 hrs 26 August 2017)**

1. **Rivers Flow Situation Reported by Flood Forecasting Division.** All rivers are flowing at Normal levels except River Kabul at Nowshera is at low flood level. Medium flooding is expected in the Nullahs of River Ravi & Chenab. Details at **Annex A.**
2. **Past Meteorological Situation and Future Forecast by PMD.** Significant rainfall reported in last 24 hours is; D.I. Khan 77 mm and Lahore 68 mm. PMD forecast for next 24 hours predicts *scattered thunderstorm / rain over Gilgit Baltistan, Malakand, Hazara, Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, D.I. Khan, Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Gujranwala, Faisalabad, Lahore & D.G. Khan Divisions alongwith Kashmir.* Details at **Annex B.**

  - c. Prudent placing and timely mobilization of earth moving machinery for restoration of **road infrastructure.**
  - d. **Owing to possibility of medium flooding in Nullahs of River Ravi & Chenab, vulnerable communities along reaches of these rivers, their tributaries & Nullahs to be sensitised for requisite precautionary measures.**

1. **Rainfall Reported Last 24 Hours**

- a. **Punjab**. Lahore 68 mm, Gujrat 33 mm, Joharabad 29 mm, Kallar 28 mm, Sargodha 27 mm, Sialkot 20 mm, Noorpur Thal 20 mm, Mangla 18 mm, Layyah 18 mm, Gujranwala 17 mm, Marala 17 mm, Jassar 16 mm, Munawar Tawi 11 mm, Mandibahauddin 8 mm, Jhang 7 mm, Sahiwal 5 mm, Jhelum 4 mm, Faisalabad 4 mm, Chakwal 4 mm, Talhatta 3 mm, Mianwali 2 mm, Sehrkikota 1 mm, D.G. Khan 1 mm, Kasur 1 mm and Pattan 1 mm.
- b. **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa**. D.I. Khan 77 mm, Dir 10 mm, Besham 4 mm, Balakot 2 mm, Mirkhani 2 mm, Kalam 1 mm and Nowshera 1 mm.
- c. **AJ&K**. Palandri 38 mm and Kotli 15 mm.
- d. **GB**. Bagrote 10 mm, Skardu 4 mm, Gupis 3 mm, Astore 3 mm, Hunza 2 mm and Gilgit 1 mm.

2. **Weather Forecast Next 24 Hours**. Scattered thunderstorm / rain is expected over Gilgit Baltistan, Malakand, Hazara, Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, D.I. Khan, Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Gujranwala, Faisalabad, Lahore & D.G. Khan Divisions alongwith Kashmir.

3. **Weather Outlook for 27 – 28 August 2017**. Wet spell is likely to decrease.

4. **Weather Last 24 Hours**. Rain-thunderstorm occurred at scattered places in upper Punjab, Malakand, Hazara, D.I. Khan Kashmir & Gilgit-Baltistan. Weather remained hot and humid elsewhere in the Country.
