

Strategic Engagement

Diplomats from Regional Countries Visited National Emergencies Operation Center (NEOC) 07-01-2025



Representatives from Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), Economic Cooperation Organization (ECO) and South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) visited National Emergencies Operation Center (NEOC).

The delegation received a comprehensive briefing on the state-of-the-art technological infrastructure and operational frameworks designed to tackle climate-induced anomalies and disasters in Pakistan and the region. Key topics included the escalating impacts of rising temperatures, coastal crises, and their implications for regional stability.

Chairman NDMA emphasized the importance of utilizing NEOC's advanced systems for real-time monitoring, disaster preparedness, and response. He also highlighted the potential for establishing a regional framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), fostering joint efforts in capacity building and knowledge sharing to enhance disaster resilience across the region.

Secretary General of ECO Secretariat, Ambassador Dr. Asad Majeed Khan, commended NDMA's proactive initiatives in disaster preparedness. He called on regional member states to prioritize DRR frameworks, noting that ECO countries collectively face annual climate-related losses of \$70 million, underscoring the urgency of regional cooperation.

NDMA, Gender Task Force and UN Agencies Host National Consultation on Women and Girls Leading Community Transformation. NDMA's Gender & Child Cell (GCC) collaborated with the Gender Task Force and UN agencies to host a two-day National Level Consultation titled "Transforming Communities through Women and Girls' Leadership for Climate Resilience and Gender Equality" in Islamabad on 14 & 15 January, 2025.

The consultation aimed to highlight the critical role women and girls play in driving transformative change within communities, particularly in the context of climate resilience and disaster management. Chairman NDMA emphasized the importance of proactive responsiveness and social resilience in disaster management. He stressed the need for adaptive measures to address climate-related challenges.

The Chairman acknowledged that disasters disproportionately affect vulnerable communities, particularly women and girls. However, it is inevitable to tap their potential for resilience-building within formal disaster risk reduction (DRR) and anticipatory action frameworks. Senator Samina Mumtaz Zehri in her address highlighted the importance of integrating gender considerations into climate strategies. She stated that in the face of growing climate challenges, empowering women and girls to take leadership roles is not just an opportunity but a necessity.

A delegation from member countries of Center on Integrated Rural Development for Asia and the Pacific (CIDRAP), an Intergovernmental Organization, mandated for promoting & strengthening Integrated Rural Development Systems for 15 Asia-Pacific Countries, visited NDMA's NEOC. This visit was part of the International training on "Disaster Management and Climate Change Adaptation" organized by AKHNCRD in collaboration with CIDRAP and NDMA.

Delegates from nine countries including Fiji, Iran, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Myanmar were part of the delegation. The delegates were briefed on the capability exposition of NEOC, a technology driven platform for early warnings development and projections of future disasters. The future disaster's trajectories developed by NEOC indicate likelihood of hazardous event, time of impact, potential losses and alerts for vulnerable audience and help enablers.

NDMA Convened first session on Water Scarcity and Food Security in Pakistan 16-01-2025



Chairman Prime Minister's Youth Programme Visited National Emergencies Operation Center at NDMA HQs 16-01-2025





Army Command & Staff College of Nepal and student officers from the US and China visited NEOC



NDMA Pakistan's delegation, headed by Chairman NDMA, participated in the 18th meeting of the Regional Consultative Committee (RCC) in Bangkok, Thailand. Two day RCC meeting from 23 – 24 January, 2025, was co-hosted by Government of Thailand and Asian Disaster Preparedness Center (ADPC). Regional Consultative Committee is a regional forum to promote consultation and cooperation in reducing disaster and climate change risk in Asia and Pacific region.



The theme of this year's RCC meeting was "Sustainable Anticipatory Actions for Resilient Development Goals", which strongly resonates with NDMA Pakistan's proactive Disaster Risk management (DRM) approach to timely anticipate disasters through advance technologies and taking appropriate actions to reduce losses.

Chairman NDMA participated as a keynote speaker in the technical session on Financial Mechanisms and Investments – Climate Finance, Investment for Resilience Building, Disaster Risk Finance. In his keynote speech, Chairman highlighted the impacts of climate change in the Asia-Pacific Region and in Pakistan, including rising temperatures, extreme weather and water-related crises threatening socio-economic development progress in the region.




