Subject: Vigorous Monsoon Activity Likely in Upper And Central Parts Of The Country
During Next Three Days (27 - 30 July 2023)

Monsoon currents from the Arabian Sea are continuously penetrating the country while a westerly wave is also present in the upper and central parts of the country. Under the combined influence of this weather system (Pakistan Meteorological Department Press Release in *Annex A*), following is forecasted: -

- a. **27 (night) to 30 July**. **Rain/wind-thundershowers** with **scattered heavy falls** is expected in the following regions: -
  - (1) <u>AJ&K</u>. Neelum valley, Muzaffarabad, Poonch, Hattian, Bagh, Haveli, Sudhanoti, Kotli, Bhimber and Mirpur.
  - (2) <u>Gilgit Baltistan.</u> Diamir, Astore, Ghizer, Skardu, Hunza, Gilgit, Ghanche and Shigar.
  - (3) <u>Khyber Pakhtunkhwa</u> Galliyat, Chitral, Dir, Swat, Shangla, Buner, Mansehra, Kohistan, Abbottabad, Haripur, Peshawar, Mardan, Swabi, Nowshera, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Kohat, Dera Ismail Khan, Bannu, Karak and Waziristan.
  - (4) <u>Punjab</u>. Murree, Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Sheikhupura, Hafizabad, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Kasur, Mianwali, Sargodha, Khushab, Faisalabad, Toba Tek Singh, Jhang, Bhakkar, Sahiwal, Bahawalnagar and Okara.
  - (5) <u>Islamabad Capital Territory</u>
- b. **27 (night) to 28 July**. **Rain/wind-thundershowers** with **few heavy falls** are expected with occasional gaps in the following regions: -
  - (1) <u>Balochistan</u>. Kalat, Khuzdar, Lasbella, Awaran, Kech, Gwadar, Panjgur, Mastung, Sibbi, Naseerabad, Zhob, Sherani, Barkhan, Musakhel, Kohlu, Jhal Magsi and Loralai.
  - (2) <u>Punjab</u>. Dera Ghazi khan, Rajanpur, Multan, Khanewal, Layyah, Kot Addu, Bahawalpur and Rahim Yar Khan.

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- 2. In light of the forecasted weather system, following impacts are expected in aforesaid regions of Pakistan:
  - a. Heavy rains may cause flash flooding in Balochistan and hill torrents of Dera Ghazi Khan from 27 (night) 28 July 2023, and in Kashmir, Dir, Swat, Kohistan, Shangla, Buner, Mansehra, Abbotabad, Rawalpindi and Islamabad including Lai Nullah from 27 (night) 29 July 2023.
  - Heavy rains may cause urban flooding in low lying areas of Islamabad,
     Rawalpindi, Peshawar, Gujaranwala, Lahore and Faislabad from 27 (night) 29 July 2023.
  - Heavy rains may trigger landslides in the vulnerable areas of Murree, Galliyat,
     Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan and hilly areas of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.
  - d. Dust storm/wind-thunderstorms & heavy falls may cause damage to loose structures such as electrical poles, solar panels, hoardings, tall trees and under construction buildings.
- 3. Apropos, all PDMAs/ GBDMA/ SDMA and ICT Administration, NHA, NH&MP, FWO, Rescue 1122, Line Departments, Ministries and Federal Agencies are required to undertake measures as per respective mandates. However, following is to be ensured by all concerned in addition to measures deemed appropriate as per on ground situation / requirements:
  - a. PMD / FFD / PDMAs / PIDs to monitor water levels in rivers, streams, and urban drainage systems continuously to detect any signs of rising water and initiate early response measures.
  - b. Proactively maintain nullahs/stormwater drains to ensure their proper functioning and prevent blockages that may lead to urban flooding.
  - c. Ensure that drainage systems are clear of debris and obstacles to facilitate the efficient flow of water and minimize risk of urban flooding.
  - d. PDMAs / GBDMA / SDMA to identify areas prone to urban flooding and implement measures such as deploying de-watering pumps to divert/drain excess water.
  - e. Ensure the availability of emergency services personnel and equipment (Rescue 1122 / Fire Brigade / Ambulance / Civil Defence, etc) in areas at high risk of urban flooding, flash flooding, hill torrents and landslides.
  - f. Preplace necessary emergency equipment at vulnerable / strategic locations to expedite response efforts.
  - g. NH&MP and Traffic Police to coordinate with Law Enforcement Agencies to manage and redirect traffic in affected areas to prevent congestion and facilitate emergency response efforts.
  - h. Coordinate with concerned departments (NHA, FWO, and C&W) for the restoration of roads in case of any blockage/obstruction.

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- i. Ensure immediate stocking of basic commodities, including paramedics and medicine, especially in regions that are likely to get cut-off during landslides / avalanches / flooding.
- j. NHA / Line Departments to conduct regular inspections of critical infrastructure, such as bridges and roads, to identify and address any vulnerabilities that may lead to structural damage during heavy rainfall.
- k. Coordinate with relevant departments to secure loose structures such as electrical poles, solar panels, hoardings, and under-construction buildings to mitigate potential damages from dust-wind/thunderstorms.
- I. Advise general public to seek shelter in safe areas such as sturdy buildings or underground structures during dust-wind/hail-thunderstorms and avoid objects that pose a risk of falling / being struck by lightning.
- m. Conduct mass public awareness campaigns to educate residents in vulnerable areas about the risks of urban flooding / landslides and precautionary measures to take.
- n. Forewarn travellers / visitors about risks posed from flooding / landslides in vulnerable locations and provide guidance and assistance in case of emergencies through local administration, police and rescue services.
- o. Advise farmers to take necessary mitigative and precautionary measures to safeguard their crops, such as timely harvesting, safe storage, or any other precautions from adverse effects of dust-wind-thunderstorms/hailstorms.
- p. Advise cattle/sheep herders to undertake necessary mitigative and precautionary measures to protect their livestock, such as safe sheltering or any other precautions from adverse effects of dust-wind-thunderstorms/hailstorms.
- q. Strengthen coordination among all relevant departments and agencies to facilitate the timely sharing of information and resources during emergency situations.
- r. Establish reliable communication channels with local communities to provide timely updates, instructions, and emergency contact information during monsoon season.
- s. Ensure widespread circulation of alerts and advisories, especially in local languages, to raise awareness and sensitize travellers / tourists and local communities in at-risk/vulnerable areas.
- t. Ensure round-the-clock monitoring of the situation through EOCs with regular feedback to PEOCs and NEOC.
- u. Share daily / routine updates with NDMA in case of any eventuality.

#### Vigorous Monsoon activity likely in upper and central parts of the country during next three days

Met Office informed that monsoon currents from Arabian Sea are continuously penetrating in the country. A westerly wave is also present upper and central parts of the country. Under the influence of this:

- Rain/wind-thundershower (with scattered heavy falls) is expected in Kashmir, (Neelum valley, Muzaffarabad, Poonch, Hattian, Bagh, Haveli, Sudhanoti, Kotli, Bhimber, Mirpur), Gilgit Baltistan (Diamir, Astore, Ghizer, Skardu, Hunza, Gilgit, Ghanche, Shigar), Chitral, Dir, Swat, Shangla, Buner, Mansehra, Kohistan, Abbottabad, Haripur, Peshawar, Mardan, Swabi, Nowshera, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Kohat, Dera Ismail Khan, Bannu, Karak, Waziristan, Murree, Galliyat, Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Sheikhupura, Hafizabad, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Kasur, Mianwali, Sargodha, Khushab, Faisalabad, Toba Tek Singh, Jhang, Bhakkar, Sahiwal, Bahawalnagar and Okara from 27th (night) to 30th July with occasional gaps.
- Rain/wind-thundershower (with few heavy falls) is expected in Kalat, Khuzdar, Lasbella, Awaran, Kech, Gwadar, Panjgur, Mastung, Sibbi, Naseerabad, Zhob, Sherani, Barkhan, Musakhel, Kohlu, Jhal Magsi, Loralai, Dera Ghazi khan, Rajanpur, Multan, Khanewal, Layyah, Kot Addu, Bahawalpur and Rahim Yar Khan on 27th (night) & 28th July.

#### **Impacts and Advises:**

- Heavy rains may generate flash flooding in Balochistan and hill torrents of Dera Ghazi Khan on 27th (night) & 28th July.
   While in Kashmir, Dir, Swat, Kohistan, Shangla, Buner, Manshera, Abbottabad, Rawalpindi/Islamabad including (Lai Nullah) during 27th (night) to 29th July.
- Heavy rains may cause urban flooding in low lying areas of Islamabad/Rawalpindi, Peshawar, Gujranwala, Lahore, Faisalabad from 27th (night) to 29th July and may trigger landslides in the vulnerable areas of Murree, Galliyat, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan and hilly areas of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa during the period.
- Farmers are advised to manage their activities keeping in view the weather forecast.
- Tourists and travelers are advised to remain extra cautious to avoid any untoward situation during the wet spell.
- Wind-thunderstorm may damage loose structures like electric poles, solar panels etc.
- General public is advised to stay at safe places during wind-storm/lightning/heavy rains.

#### NOTE:

All concerned authorities are advised to remain <u>ALERT</u> and to take necessary precautionary measure during the forecast period.
