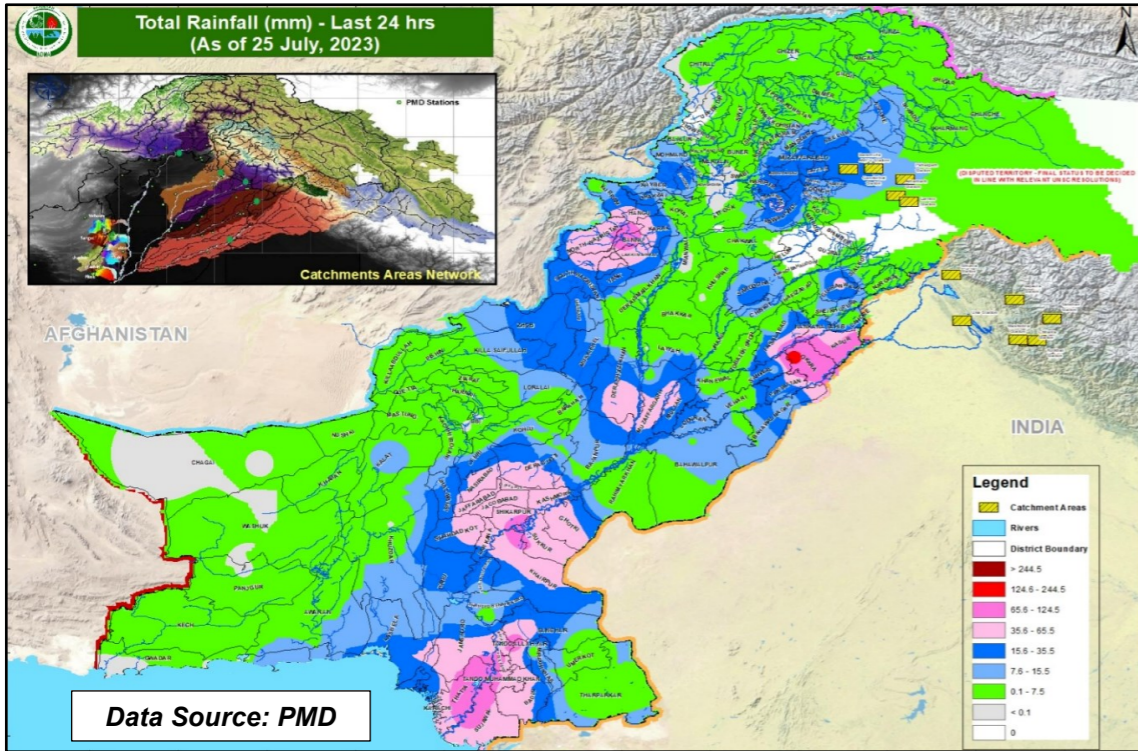
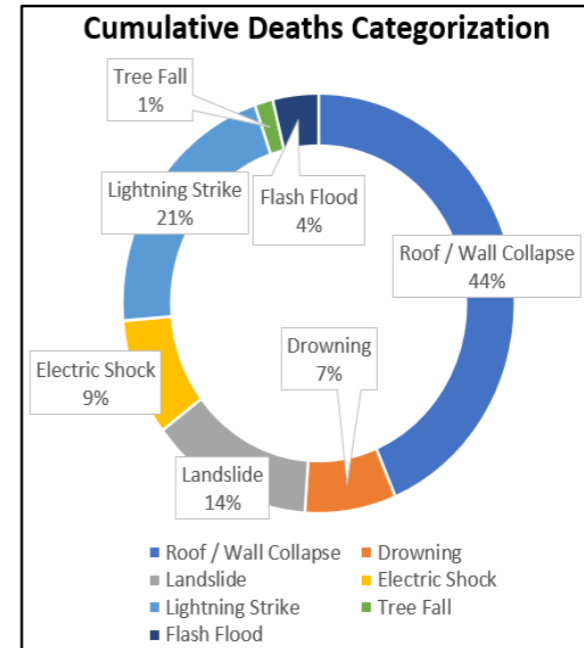
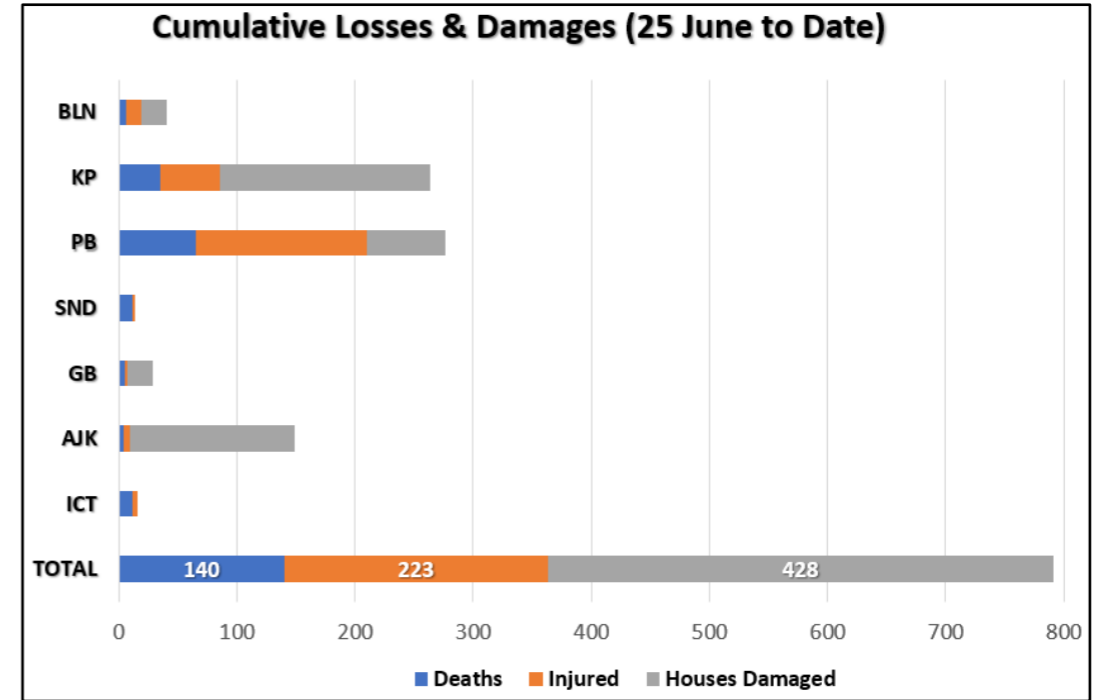


NDMA – MONSOON SEASON 2023 – MULTIPLE MODEL PROJECTION (25 JULY – 1200 hrs)

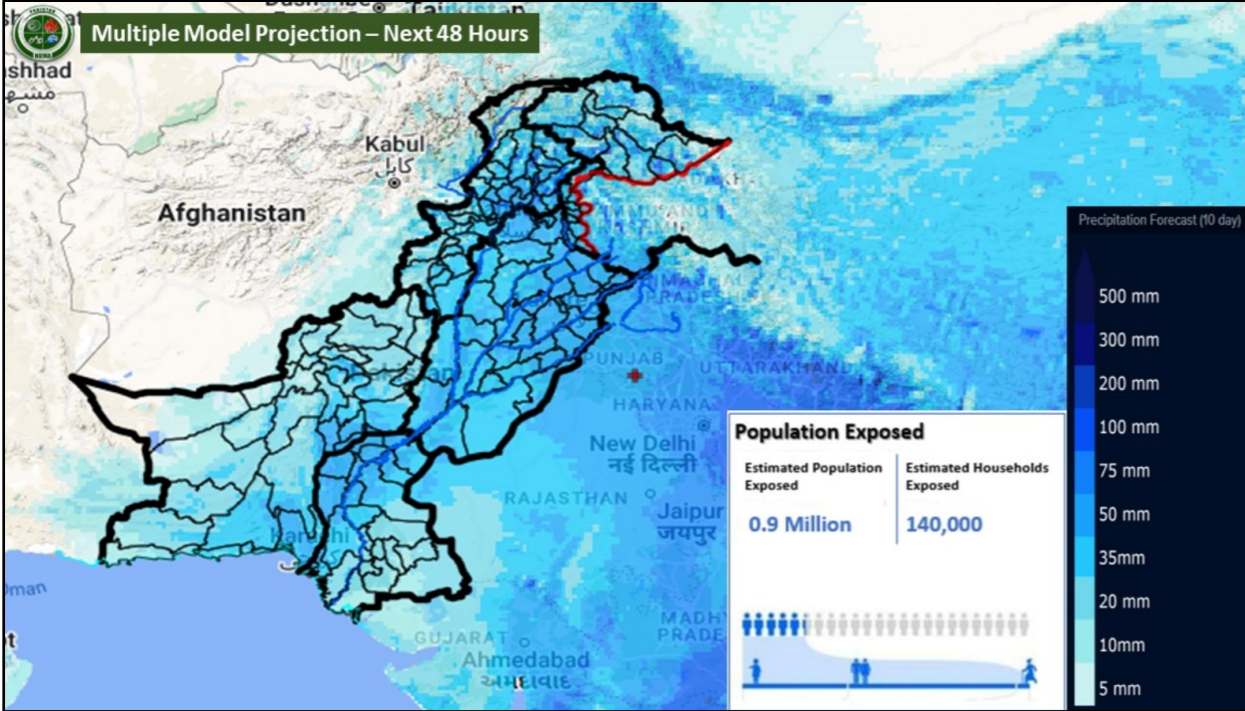

FORECASTED IMPACT NEXT 48-72 HOURS

- Flash Flooding of Moderate to Heavy intensity is expected in the Nullahs of Balochistan (Loralai, Kalat, Sibbi, Makran, Naseerabad Divisions) and Hill Torrents of D.G Khan Division during next 24-hours. Flash Flooding is also expected in the Tributaries of River Kabul.
- Rain-Wind-Thundershowers with few heavy falls
 - Balochistan (Kalat, Khuzdar, Lasbela, Awaran, Kech, Gwadar, Panjgur, Kharan, Nushki, Washuk, Mastung, Sibbi, Naseerabad, Zhob, Sherani, Barkhan, Musakhel, Kohlu, Jhal Magsi, Loralai, Ziarat, Quetta, Chaman, Pishin, Qila, Abdullah and Qila Saifullah).
 - Punjab (DG Khan, Rajanpur, Multan, Khanewal, Bhakkar, Layyah, Kot Addu, Bahawalpur and RY Khan).
 - Sindh (Tharparkar, Umerkot, Mirpurkhas, Sukkur, Larkana, Jacobabad, Dadu, Shaheed Benazirabad, Hyderabad, Sanghar, Badin, Thatta and Karachi).
- Rain-Wind-Thundershowers with isolated heavy falls
 - Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (Galliyat, Chitral, Dir, Swat, Shangla, Buner, Mansehra, Kohistan, Abbottabad, Haripur, Peshawar, Mardan, Swabi, Nowshera, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Kohat, Dera Ismail Khan, Bannu, Karak and Waziristan).
 - Punjab (Murree, Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Sheikhpura, Hafizabad, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Kasur, Mianwali, Sargodha, Khusab, Faisalabad, Toba Tek Singh, Jhang, Sahiwal, Bahawalnagar and Okara).
 - Gilgit Baltistan (Diامر, Astore, Ghizer, Skardu, Hunza, Gilgit, Ghanche and Shigar).
 - State of AJ&K (Neelum, Muzaffarabad, Poonch, Hattian, Bagh, Haveli, Sudhnoti, Kotli, Bhimber and Mirpur).
 - Islamabad Capital Territory
- Urban flooding in municipal areas (as indicated above). Flash flooding and landsliding in hilly / mountainous regions of Balochistan, KP, Punjab, GB & AJK (as indicated above). Hill Torrents of DG Khan, Rajanpur, Barkhan and Dera Bugti to remain active with Moderate intensity.
- Flows in rivers and streams of Gilgit Baltistan likely to increase and high probability / risk of GLOF incident in vulnerable mountain valleys.

GUIDANCE ISSUED

- City / District Administrations are to ensure contingency traffic plans for areas vulnerable to flooding in urban centres, (as indicated above) catering for prompt de-watering operations in flooded areas.
- PDMA to undertake regular public awareness on all media channels / social media to maximise general public's knowledge on risks associated with monsoon season; heavy rains, urban flooding, flash flooding, landslides, etc.
- PDMA to ensure early warning & prompt response in vulnerable areas in light of wind-thundershowers and possibility of heavy falls (in areas indicated above), increased river flows and flash flooding.
- PDMA Balochistan & Punjab to ensure early warning, prompt evacuation and response in vulnerable low-lying areas adjacent to nullahs / hill torrents (in areas indicated above).
- GBDMA to ensure all necessary measures are undertaken to mitigate / prepare against GLOF incidents.
- NHA / FWO / Local C&W Depts to ensure pre-placement of machinery and timely restoration of damaged road linkages.
- Rescue Services, Armed Forces and leading NGOs / CSOs to ensure availability of personnel / equipment in the indicated areas & be on stand-by for rapid response.
