Passengers were received by Federal Minister Ahsan Iqbal and Chairman NDMA at Islamabad International Airport.

Dispatch of Emergency Medical Supplies and Evacuation of Patients from Parachinar on PM's Direction

25 December, 2024



NDMA launched an emergency relief operation to address the critical shortage of medical supplies caused by road blockages in Parachinar.

NDMA, in coordination with the Ministry of Health, arranged the transportation of 1000 kilograms of urgently required medicines. Two heli flights, each carrying 500 kilograms of medicines, departed from Islamabad to Parachinar.

Evacuated 8-year-old Subah Hussain, diagnosed with a brain tumor . This swift and coordinated response highlights the Government of Pakistan's commitment to safeguarding public health and ensuring the well-being of citizens during crises.

Visit of Earth Sciences, Environment, Development Studies, and Disaster Management Department from Bahria University 12 December, 2024




