# DETAILS OF MAJOR INCIDENTS/LOSSES/DAMAGES DUE TO NATURAL/OTHER CALAMITY

- 1. **Punjab**. On 2-5 July 2021, following number of deaths were reported in Punjab:
  - a. 5x deaths in District Gujrat & 1x death in District Bhakkar due to wall / building collapsed due to heavy rains and windstorm.
- 2. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. On 1-5 July 2021, following number of deaths were reported in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:
  - a. <u>District Karak</u>. On 02-07-2021, due to rain/ hailstorm at Moza Kangar Halqa Methakhal Karak, the following damages have been reported:-
    - (1) 1x Camel was perished.
    - (2) 2x Boundary walls were collapsed.
    - (3) Two rooms in the house were collapsed.
    - (4) A roof of a room collapsed in the house.
  - b. **District Khyber**. As reported on 04-07-2021, a roof collapsed in the hujra due to gusty winds near Jamrud Shah Zaman Kiln, resultantly two persons got injured.
  - c. **District Malakand**. As reported on 04-07-2021, due to heavy rain/ gusty winds 2x persons have been died due to the fallen of a tree.
  - d. **District Mardan**. As reported, on 04-07-2021, due to heavy rain/ thunderstorms & Gusty Winds the following damages have been reported:-
    - (1) 1x Female was severely injured due to door collapsed.
    - (2) 1x Child was seriously injured due to wall collapsed.
  - e. **District Swabi**. On 04-07-2021, due to heavy rain/ Gusty Winds, the following damages have been reported:-
    - (1) 1x Boundary Wall collapsed resultantly 1x female died while 1x male got injured.
    - (2) 1x Room collapsed in the house resultantly 1x male got injured.

3. **Balochistan**. On 3 July 2021, 1x death was reported in Kingri, District Musakhel due to flash floods.

4. <u>Gilgit-Baltistan</u>. On 5 July 2021 at 0930 hrs, avalanche / landslide occurred at 2 x points at Satrangi Lake, Naltar Valley. 2 x Males & 2 x Females (4 x Persons) have been reported missing.
