SUBJECT: -RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST:

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST:

River Sutlej at Sulemanki is in Low Flood Level, while all the other Major Rivers are flowing below low flood level.

- II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:
- a. Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Northeast Afghanistan today lies over Northen parts of the country.
- b. Moderate Moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating to upper parts of the country up to 5000 feet.
- c. Well-Marked Seasonal low lies over North Balochistan and its trough is extending Northeastwards.
- d. A monsoon Low is likely to develop over North Bay of Bengal.
- III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:

Scattered wind thunderstorm/ rain of moderate intensity with Isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Islamabad and Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, D.I Khan, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Lahore, Faisalabad, Multan, Sahiwal, D.G Khan & Bahawalpur Divisions. Isolated wind thunderstorm/rain is also expected over Zhob, Loralai, Sibbi, Nasirabad & Kalat Divisions.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS:

Wet spell is likely to continue.
