River Kabul at Nowshera is in medium flood level, River Indus at Tarbela, Kalabagh, Chashma & Tunsa, River Ravi at Balloki and River Sutlej at Sulemanki are in low flood level.

- ALERT: Flash flooding of Moderate to heavy intensity is expected in the Nullahs of Balochistan (Loralai, Kalat, Sibbi, Makran,
 - Nasirabad Divisions) and in Hill Torrents of D.G khan Division during 48-hours.
 - II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:
 - Yesterday's monsoon low over Southwest Madhya Pradesh & adjoining Rajasthan has weakened into trough. a.
 - b. Moderate to Strong moist currents from Bay of Bengal and Arabian Sea are penetrating to lower half of the country up to 5000 feet
 - c. Seasonal low lies over North Balochistan.
 - III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:

Scattered to widespread wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate to heavy intensity with isolated very heavy falls is expected over South & Southeast Sindh along with Zhob, Loralai, Kalat, Sibbi, Makran, Nasirabad, D.G. Khan, D.I. Khan, Bannu & Kohat Divisions. Scattered thunderstorm rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Islamabad and Rawalpindi, Peshawar & upper Sindh.
