- 4. <u>Threat to Next Likely Areas</u>. Districts of **Sindh** (Karachi, Hyderabad, Thatta, Badin, Mirpurkhas, Thaparker, Umerkot, Sanghar, Shaheed Benazirabad, Nosheroferoz, TMK, TAY, Dadu, Jamshoro, Sukkur, Larkana, Jacobabad, Shikarpur & Ghotki) & Districts of **Balochistan** (Bela, Awaran, Kech, Makran and Panjgur).
- 5. <u>River Discharges</u>. All the Major Rivers are flowing below "Flood Limits". Flood situation (Heavy to Very Heavy) is expected in the local Rivers/ Nullahs/ Streams of Eastern and Coastal Balochistan from 30<sup>th</sup> September to 2<sup>nd</sup> October, 2021. Urban Flooding is also expected in Sindh from 30<sup>th</sup> September to 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2021. Details of river discharges is attached as **Annex B**.

- 7. Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours by PMD. Widespread thunderstorm/rain with scattered HEAVY to VERY HEAVY falls and isolated EXTREMELY HEAVY falls is expected over Sindh along with Eastern & Coastal Balochistan. Scattered thunder/storm rain of light to moderate intensity is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Islamabad and Peshawar, Kohat Bannu, DI Khan, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, DG Khan & Bahawalpur Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm/rain is also expected over Sargodha, Lahore & Faisalabad Divisions.

#### 9. Weather Advisory / Press Release

- a. In response to PMD press release NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 24<sup>th</sup> September 2021 Met Office informed that monsoon currents are likely to penetrate in Sindh from 27<sup>th</sup> September (Monday) and likely to continue till 02<sup>nd</sup> October (Saturday). Under the influence of this weather system:-
  - (1) Rain-wind-thundershower is expected in Mirpur Khas, Thar Parker, Umar Kot, Sanghar, Thatta, Badin, Karachi, Hyderabad, Tando Allayar, Tando Muhammad Khan, Mitiari, Shaheed Benazirabad, Dadu, Kalat, Khuzdar and Lasbella from 28<sup>th</sup> September (Tuesday) to 02<sup>nd</sup> October (Saturday) with occasional gaps. Heavy falls are also expected in Karachi, Thatta, Badin, Dadu and Hyderabad during the period.

- (2) Rain-wind-thundershower is also expected at scattered places in Sukkur, Larkana, Jacobabad, Kohlu, Sibbi, Naseerabad, Barkhan, Zhob, Dera Ghazi Khan, Rajanpur and Bahawalpur during 28<sup>th</sup> September (Tuesday) to 30<sup>th</sup> September (Thursday).
- (3) Isolated Rain-wind-thunderstorm is expected in Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, Islamabad, Northeast Punjab, Upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa during 27<sup>th</sup>/28<sup>th</sup> September, 30<sup>th</sup> September (Thursday) and 1<sup>st</sup> October (Friday).
- b. In response to PMD weather alert NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2021 that that a low-pressure area (remnant of the Cyclonic Storm "Gulab") currently lying over central India is likely to track in northwest direction (towards Indian Gujarat area). The system is likely to re-emerge over the Northeast Arabian Sea by 29<sup>th</sup> September (Wednesday night) / 30<sup>th</sup> September (Thursday morning) and regain intensity due to favorable environmental conditions. Under its influence:-
  - (1) Widespread rain-wind-thunderstorms with scattered heavy/very heavy falls extremely heavy at times are likely in Karachi, Hyderabad, Thatta, Badin, Mirpurkhas, Thaparker, Umerkot, Sanghar, Shaheed Benazirabad, Nosheroferoz, TMK, TAY, Dadu, Jamshoro, Sukkur, Larkana, Jacobabad, Shikarpur & Ghotki districts during Tuesday till Saturday (28th September - 2nd October 2021).
  - (2) Widespread rain-wind-thunderstorms with scattered heavy/very heavy falls extremely heavy at times are likely in Bela, Awaran, Kech, Makran and Panjgur districts of Balochistan during Thursday till Sunday (30<sup>th</sup> September 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2021).

#### Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

• 2 x Bridges i.e. Ayub bridge & Nowshera bridge were damaged in District Abbottabad on 11 July 2021.

#### Balochistan.

• 1 x Bridge was damaged in District Sibbi on 20th July 2021.

#### Gilgit Baltistan.

#### Foot/ Wooden Bridges:

- Chirah Wooden suspension Bridge (pedestrian bridge) got damaged in District Gilgit on 28th July 2021.
- 1 x Wooden Bridge at Yashkuk glacier got damaged in District Hunza on 30th July 2021.
- 1 x Wooden Bridge on Road Zoodkhun to Ziarat got damaged in District Hunza on 31 July 2021.

#### Road Bridges:

- 1 x Truss Bridge about 40 ft span on Road Zoodkhun to Ziarat got damaged in District Hunza on 31 July 2021.
- Bailey Bridge on Thogmus nullah got damaged in District Ghanche on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2021.
- Sholja Bridge got damaged in District Ghizer on 30<sup>th</sup> July 2021.
- 1 x Bridge got damaged in Badswat, Ishkoman Valley on 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021.
