DETAILS OF DAMAGED BRIDGES

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

 2 x Bridges i.e. Ayub bridge & Nowshera bridge were damaged in District Abbottabad on 11 July 2021.

Balochistan.

• 1 x Bridge was damaged in District Sibbi on 20th July 2021.

<u>Gilgit Baltistan</u>.

Foot/ Wooden Bridges:

- Chirah Wooden suspension Bridge (pedestrian bridge) got damaged in District Gilgit on 28th July 2021.
- 1 x Wooden Bridge at Yashkuk glacier got damaged in District Hunza on 30th July 2021.
- 1 x Wooden Bridge on Road Zoodkhun to Ziarat got damaged in District Hunza on 31 July 2021.
