I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST:

All the Major Rivers are flowing Below Low Flood level.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Northern parts of Iran today lies over Northern parts of Afghanistan.
- b. Yesterday's low Pressure over West Rajasthan today lies over Southwest Rajasthan.
- c. Strong moist currents from Arabian Sea are penetrating to lower half of the country up to 7000 feet.
- d. Weak Seasonal low lies over West Balochistan.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:

Scattered to widespread wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate to heavy intensity is expected over South Sindh. Scattered wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers, Islamabad along with Rawalpindi & Bahawalpur Divisions. Isolated wind thunderstorm/rain of light to moderate intensity is expected over rest of Panjab, Eastern Balochistan along with Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu & D.I Khan Divisions.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR FURTHER 48-HOURS:

Wet spell over South Sindh is likely to decrease significantly, while a fresh wet spell of moderate rainfall activity is likely to start over the upper half of the country from the evening of 21st September, 2023.
