

National Resilience Day 8 October, 2024

The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) marked National Resilience Day with a full-day event at the National Emergencies Operation Center (NEOC), NDMA Headquarters. This annual observance reflects Pakistan's solidarity with the victims of the 2005 earthquake and all those affected by past disasters, while reaffirming the nation's unwavering commitment to advancing disaster preparedness and building resilience against future crises.



Chairman NDMA, Lieutenant General Inam Haider Malik, emphasized Pakistan's National Vision for Proactive Disaster Management, highlighting the transformative shift from a reactive to a proactive disaster management approach. He highlighted the establishment of state-of-the-art National Emergencies Operation Center, inaugurated by the Prime Minister on October 5, 2023, which is equipped by cutting-edge satellite feeds, advanced software, and Al tools. He apprised that the NEOC developed a futuristic National Common Operating Picture (NCOP), which enhances digital risk assessments, early warning systems, and preparedness strategies to safeguard Pakistan's future.

On the instructions of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, the National Emergency Operations Center (NE) at the NDMA headquarters on Friday to provide humanitarian assistance to the war-torn people of Gaza and Lebanon in the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA). OC) National Conference was held. The conference was chaired by the Federal Minister for Planning and Special Measures Mr. Ahsan Igbal.



Federal Minister Ahsan Iqbal stressed the urgent need to provide aid to the affected population in view of the ongoing war situation in Palestine and Lebanon and the needs of the people there. He reiterated the Government of Pakistan's commitment to help the people in distress and emphasized the importance of the cooperation of humanitarian organizations and the people of Pakistan to enhance these efforts. The event also featured messages by NDMA's global partners addressing critical issues for Pakistan's resilience, climate change and opportunities for Pakistan to explore COP29 avenue in November 2024.

The participants of the meeting reiterated their unwavering support and solidarity with the war-torn people of Gaza and Lebanon and expressed their full commitment to continue their welfare efforts and on behalf of the Ministers and participants NDMA, Ministry of External Affairs, Armed Forces And the efforts of welfare organizations were appreciated.

Federal Minister Ahsan Iqbal Visited NEOC 11 October, 2024







According to the instructions of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, aid is being sent to the war-torn people of Lebanon on welfare basis. On the instructions of the Prime Minister, NDMA organized a special flight for 79 Pakistanis stranded in Lebanon on October 9, 2024, which arrived at Karachi's Jinnah International Airport. Sindh Governor Kamran Tasuri, Federal Minister Khalid Maqbool Siddiqui and Provincial Industries Minister Jam Ikramullah Dehrijo welcomed the Pakistanis coming from Lebanon.



Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar held a meeting with NDMA on Pakistan's humanitarian assistance plan for affected people of Gaza and Middle East. He commended NDMA's valuable contributions and directed the continuation of humanitarian aid efforts by Government of Pakistan, aligning with the All Parties Conference declaration of October 7, 2024.



On the directives of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) continues to provide humanitarian aid to the war-affected people of Gaza and Lebanon. This aid shipment, sent by NDMA in collaboration with Al-Khidmat Foundation, comprises approximately 100 tons of supplies, including medicines, ready-to-eat meat, tents, tarpaulins, warm bedding, winter clothing, and powdered milk. The aid was dispatched via flight from Jinnah International Airport, Karachi, to Beirut, Lebanon.



A high-level coordination meeting was held today at National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) to review and plan Pakistan's ongoing humanitarian relief efforts for the war-affected populations of Gaza and Lebanon. The meeting was co-chaired by Federal Minister Mr. Ahsan Iqbal, and Chairman NDMA, Lt Gen Inam Haider Malik. Senior officials from the Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and NDMA were also present at the meeting in Islamabad, while the Ambassadors of Lebanon, Jordan, and Iraq participated via Zoom.




On the instructions of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has dispatched the 13th consignment of emergency aid to the war-torn people of Gaza and Lebanon. The 100 tons of relief supplies include winter tents and blankets. On the instructions of the Prime Minister, a relief shipment has been dispatched from Islamabad International Airport to Amman (Jordan) for the people of Gaza.



On the direction of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) continues to provide humanitarian aid to the wartorn people of Gaza and Lebanon. On Sunday, it has been sent from Karachi to Lebanon. The relief consignment sent by NDMA with the support of Al-Khidmat Foundation contains 17 tons of goods including medicines, ready-made food, tents, warm clothes and dry milk. Sent to Lebanon.



On the instructions of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has dispatched two more consignments of emergency aid to the war-torn people of Gaza and Lebanon. Today the 15th and 16th emergency relief supplies were dispatched from Islamabad by two convoys of NDMA 200 tonne NLC each containing 100 tonne supplies for both countries. Equipment includes winter tents and blankets.



The 13th consignment of humanitarian aid for Gaza has successfully landed in Amman, Jordan, via a chartered flight, carrying 100 tons of relief items. This aid will be transported by road to Gaza with the support of the Hashemite Organization. The Government of Pakistan remains steadfast in its commitment to providing humanitarian assistance to the war-affected people of Gaza and Lebanon.



On the direction of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) continues to provide relief to the war-torn people of Palestine, Gaza and Lebanon on a welfare basis. In this relief shipment sent by NDMA, 95 tons of goods including family tents and blankets were sent to Lebanon for winter protection. The aid plane took off from Islamabad International Airport to Beirut, Lebanon.
