NDMA Conducted Sixth International Simulation Exercise (CISE 6/2025) 01-10-2025



The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) successfully conducted the Sixth Comprehensive International Simulation Exercise (CISE 6/2025), which focused on a cyclone contingency scenario within Pakistan's geographical context.

Participants from Thailand, China, Uzbekistan, Iran, Türkiye, Kazakhstan, Azerbaijan, Sri Lanka, Fiji, Bangladesh, Kyrgyzstan, and Turkmenistan, along with regional bodies such as ECO, UN agencies, and local NGOs, took part in the exercise.

Held in a hybrid format at the National Emergencies Operations Centre (NEOC), the event engaged all NDMA wings and featured international experts who shared insights and offered constructive feedback. The exercise served as a platform for knowledge exchange, collaboration, and strengthening disaster preparedness and response capacities.

China Extended Additional Monsoon Relief Assistance to Pakistan 04-10-2025



China once again demonstrated its solidarity with Pakistan by dispatching an additional consignment of humanitarian relief goods for flood-affected families. A special relief aircraft weighing 90 tons arrived at Islamabad International Airport, carried 700 tents, 16,000 blankets, 1,000 life jackets, and 4,000 sleeping bags to support communities impacted by the floods.

Earlier, on September 28, 2025, China had sent two relief flights carried 300 tents and 9,000 blankets, underscoring its continued support for Pakistan in times of crisis.

In line with the directives of the Prime Minister, NDMA, in coordination with relevant government institutions, ensured the swift distribution of all relief assistance to the affected population.

The Government of Pakistan appreciated China's timely humanitarian assistance, which reaffirmed the strong bonds of friendship and cooperation between the two countries.

Pakistan Dispatched 24th Relief Consignment to Gaza 13-10-2025



Under the directive of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) coordinated the dispatch of the 24th relief consignment, carrying 100 tons of humanitarian aid for the people of Gaza, Palestine. The consignment was sent through a chartered flight with the support of Al-Khidmat Foundation.

It included flour, rice, sweet corn, chickpeas, ready-to-eat meals, cooking oil, and fruit cocktails, and was routed from Allama Iqbal International Airport, Lahore, to Gaza via Egypt. This consignment brought Pakistan's total relief assistance to 2,327 tons.

A send-off ceremony was held at the airport and was attended by officials from NDMA, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA), and representatives of the Al-Khidmat Foundation.

NIDM Signed Letter of Agreement with University of Baltistan, Skardu 14-10-2025



The National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM), the think tank of NDMA, and the University of Baltistan, Skardu (UOBS), signed a Letter of Agreement (LoA) to promote collaboration in research, knowledge sharing, and capacity building focused on Pakistan's mountain regions — among the most climate-sensitive areas in the world.

The LoA was signed by Prof. Dr. Abdul Matin, Vice Chancellor UOBS, and Mr. Tanveer Piracha, Executive Director NIDM, in the presence of Prof. Dr. Ashfaque Ahmad Shah, Dean, Faculty of Education, Humanities, and Social Sciences.

The Vice Chancellor later visited NDMA's National Emergencies Operation Centre (NEOC) and the Centre of Excellence on Climate Change and Disaster Management (CoE-C2DM). During the visit, UOBS requested internship opportunities for its students at NDMA and NEOC to enhance their professional skills and practical understanding of disaster resilience.

NDMA Convened Coordination Conference on Winter Contingencies 28-10-2025




The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) convened a Winter Contingencies Coordination Conference at its National Emergencies Operation Centre (NEOC) to review preparedness and coordination mechanisms in light of Disaster Early Warning (DEW-4) for October 2025 to January 2026. The conference aimed to ensure effective management of potential winter hazards and support safe, sustained tourism across the country.

The session focused on strengthening inter-agency coordination among federal, provincial, and regional disaster management authorities, line departments, and relevant stakeholders to ensure timely response and resource availability during the season. Participants discussed measures for managing tourist influx, accommodation capacity, and emergency facilitation in snow-prone and high-altitude areas.

Representatives from all PDMAs, line departments, and rescue services attended the conference. The deliberations emphasized synchronized preparedness and proactive coordination to safeguard public safety and promote safe winter tourism. NDMA reaffirmed its commitment to maintaining close coordination with all stakeholders to ensure protection of lives and property during the winter season.


