- 7. <u>Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours by PMD</u>. Scattered thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is expected over the upper catchments of all major rivers along with Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, Rawalpindi and Gujranwala and Sargodha Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over Lahore Division.

- 9. <u>Weather Advisory / Press Release</u> In response to PMD weather alert NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 26th August 2021 that more monsoon currents are likely to penetrate in upper parts of the country from Friday (Evening/Night) and likely to continue till Wednesday (27th August 01st September 2021). Under the influence of this weather system, following is predicted:
 - a. Rain-wind-thundershower is expected in Kashmir, Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Gujrat, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Lahore, Okara, Faisalabad, Sargodha, Mianwali, Kohistan, Shangla, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Haripur, Mardan, Charsadda, Nowshera, Dir, Chitral, Peshawar, Kohat, Waziristan, Gilgit-Baltistan (Ghizer, Astore, Diamir, Skardu, Gilgit, Hunza, Nagar, Ghanche and Kharmang) with occasional gaps from Friday (Evening/Night) to Wednesday (27th August 01st September 2021).
 - b. Heavy falls are also expected in Dir, Kohistan, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Muzaffarabad, Rawalpindi/Islamabad, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Lahore and Kasur from Sunday night to Tuesday (29th - 31st August 2021).
 - c. Rain-wind-thunderstorm is also expected in Tank, Karak, Bannu, D.I. Khan, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Bhakkar, Layyah, Sahiwal, Bahawalnagar, Dera Ghazi Khan, Rajanpur, Khanpur, Khanewal, Multan, Kohlu, Loralai, Barkhan, Zhob, Musa khel, Quetta, Ziarat and Kalat on Monday (Evening/Night) and Wednesday (30th August 01st September 2021).
