### SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

#### **HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK** I:

The River Indus is currently in low flood level at Chashma, Taunsa, Guddu, and Sukkur while, all other major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

Flash flooding is expected in hill torrents of DG Khan Division and east Balochistan from 13th to 15th July.

#### **II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES**

- A fresh trough of westerly wave lies over north Afghanistan. 1.
- Weak monsoon currents originating from the Arabian Sea are penetrating into the lower half of the country. 2.
- Yesterday's MONSOON LOW over north Chhattisgarh today lies over north Madhya Pradesh (India). 3
- 4 Weak seasonal low lies over Northwest Balochistan.

#### **III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS**

Scattered thunderstorm/rain with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of rivers Kabul and Indus along with Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, DI Khan and DG Khan Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is also expected over the upper catchments of all the other major rivers along with northeast Punjab, East Balochistan, Multan and Bahawalpur Divisions.

#### **IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS**

Monsoon activity is likely to increase.
