SUBJECT: -RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST:**I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST:**

River Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala, Sulemanki & Islam is in Medium flood level. River Indus at Guddu is in low flood level.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:

- a. Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Kashmir & adjoining area has moved away Eastwards. A fresh trough of westerly wave lies over Northern parts of Iran.
- b. Light to Moderate moist currents from Arabian Sea are penetrating to central and upper parts of the country up to 5000 feet.
- c. Well-marked Seasonal low lies over East Balochistan.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:

Mainly dry weather is expected over the most parts of the country, however isolated wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers, Islamabad along with Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, D.I Khan, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Lahore, Multan & D.G Khan Divisions.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS:

Wet spell is likely to decrease further.
