



SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION AT 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK:

- River Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala is in Very High Flood, at Sulemanki and Islam is in High Flood Level.
- The River Chenab at Panjnad is in Very High Flood level, at Trimmu is in medium Flood Level.
- The River Ravi at Sidhnai is in Very High Flood, at Balloki is in medium Flood Level.
- The River Indus at Guddu and Sukkur is in Medium Flood Level, whereas at Kotri is in Low Flood Level.
- River Indus at Guddu is expected to attain Very High Flood level during next 24-hours.
- River Indus at Sukur is expected to attain High Flood level after 24-hours.

METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES: II.

- Yesterday's depression over Hyderabad moved southwestwards, weakened into a low, and today lies south of Ormara in Arabian sea.
- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over north of the country has moved away eastwards.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS: III.

- Scattered to widespread thunderstorm/rain with isolated heavy to very heavy falls is expected over coastal region of Balochistan.
- No Significant weather is expected over the rest of the country.

WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS: IV.

No Significant weather is expected in the country
