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I. Executive Summary

The October 2005 earthquake has had a devastating impact on human life and social infrastructure. The situation has been further exacerbated due to loss of assets. The catastrophe has affected all population groups but there is a variation in experience of women, men, boys, and girls. Consequently, for the recovery, reconstruction and rehabilitation efforts to be considered successful, our response to the disaster must be relevant to the needs, concerns and priorities of both women and men, as well as girls and boys, leading to their equal enjoyment of socially valued goods, services and opportunities, resources and rewards.

ERRA is committed to ensuring that sectoral strategies, programme implementation, monitoring and evaluation take into account gender considerations thereby increasing the likelihood that the benefits of reconstruction and rehabilitation accrue to women, men, girls and boys, as well as to members of vulnerable groups.

In the post earthquake scenario social sector delivery projects such as health and education are deemed critical but provision of equitable economic opportunities and services are equally important for improving living conditions of affected populations.

This report maps out interventions adopted by organisations to cater to the needs of women and girls specifically and also to address gender related issues in Reconstruction and Rehabilitation. These include some of the steps taken to create a more enabling environment for the participation of women, girls and vulnerable groups.

Gaining a better understanding of the geographical coverage, the nature, and reach (in terms of beneficiaries) of these programmes and projects is essential to determine the relevance and effectiveness of the recovery, reconstruction and rehabilitation efforts.

It should be noted that the inventory of programmes and projects assembled on the basis of partner organisations responses to our survey reflects the diverse perspective of a range of stakeholders and their understanding of gender concepts and programming, which does not necessarily reflect ERRA's perspective.

The report highlights that a number of gender sensitive and needs oriented actions are being undertaken in the earthquake affected districts, even though the scope and reach of these actions still need to be further qualified and quantified. Yet, gender programming is at times still misconstrued to mean women specific projects only, and in most instances address women and girls' practical needs but not their strategic interests. Although there is no denial that these initiatives are an essential requirement as women and girls are at a greater risk and vulnerability, the location and implementation approach of these initiatives may be an indication of the local context and related constraints, as well as a reflection of the specific organisational methodologies. Interestingly a number of GoP programmes in support of gender mainstreaming have been identified.

It is anticipated that this document that includes information disaggregated by district and sector can serve as a tool for different stakeholders to identify gaps and to guide future programming design and implementation.

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B. Findings and Conclusions

The situation in the earthquake affected areas (EQAA) is no different than in other parts of the country where societal norms perceive women primarily in a care giver role and also as passive recipients of support services. Yet, there is a growing recognition among different actors to evolve strategies to reduce disparity and inequality by attaching importance to the participation of women specially and of other vulnerable population groups so that initiatives are needs oriented, of a participatory nature and carry elements of sustainability.

Based on their past experiences and organizational methodologies diverse response programmes and projects are being implemented, which hold great relevance and promise.

In reviewing the list of programmes and projects, it becomes clear that in order to achieve fairness, social and economic opportunities and benefits have to be promoted. Advocacy is also required for designing and implementing programmes and projects that will improve decision making patterns, access to and control over resources, as few projects address strategic interests of affectees, particularly women's and girls. In addition, based on the number of projects implemented in the EQAA listed in the table on the previous page, it is clear that disparities in programme and project implementation and service delivery, between and among districts, need to be examined and efforts made to redress the situation, particularly in Kohistan and Shangla.

The other important facet that calls attention is the need to link voices of women and men from different levels to the reconstruction process so that there is effectiveness and relevance in conceived programmes and actions.

In light of the above, it will be important to organize information sessions at the district level where the findings of the survey on services of interest to women and gender programming can be disseminated, along with the Gender Policy for the EQAA. Such sessions will be helpful in setting-up local networks on gender and reconstruction, a forum to exchange experiences and information at the district level, with a view of strengthening capacity to mainstream gender in project implementation, while also informing discussions of the ERRA Gender Core Group.

It will also be essential to foster ongoing dialogue in communities with different groups, using evidence from the ground, to build a greater understanding and acknowledgment of the reality and the productive contributions of all members of society, with particular attention to women's contributions.

Finally, the next study to assess the level of services of interest to women and gender programming should gather information on the scope (i.e. financial, geographical), the reach (i.e. number of direct program/project beneficiaries), and change in the condition and position of affectees as a result of the presence and implementation of a given programme/project.

II. Introduction

ERRA-INFOCH (Information Clearing House) has been established by ERRA M&E Wing with IASCI (International Agency for Source Country Information) acting as implementing partner. ERRA-INFOCH initiated its operations in December 2006 and represents an integrated, field tested, highly effective data management mechanism that is specially designed to support information coherence with efficiency. The central unit of ERRA-INFOCH is an integral part of the Monitoring and Evaluation Wing of ERRA, and has established a field network with 9 offices in the two zones of NWFP and AJ&K.

In March 2007, ERRA-INFOCH was tasked to conduct an assessment on services for women (programmes, projects and activities of governmental as well as non-governmental organisations) available within the earthquake affected areas (EQAA) of Pakistan (i.e. NWFP and AJ&K). Upon request by the Gender Equality Team of ERRA, the information compiled by ERRA-INFOCH was transcribed and amended in the form of an Assessment Report presented here. ERRA-INFOCH will update this information on a regular basis (every 6 months unless otherwise requested).

The objective of this inventory and gap-analysis is to assist and aid a multitude of end-users, ranging from individuals seeking specific assistance in a certain geographical area, to the NGO community aiming at improved inter-agency co-ordination up to policy making and programming of donors and government.

As has been broadly acknowledged by a range of stakeholders, in the post earthquake scenario social sector delivery projects such as health and education are critical. However, in order to improve living conditions, provision of equitable economic opportunities is equally important for affected populations. No doubt, the presence of the inventoried programmes and projects is evidence of the readiness of organisations from both the public sector and civil society to address the needs of residents of the earthquake affected districts.

Equitable geographical coverage as well as the nature of these programmes and projects will be essential to the success of the recovery, reconstruction and rehabilitation efforts. The understanding that the response to the disaster must be relevant to the needs, concerns and priorities of women and men, as well as of girls and boys, is also of critical importance.

III. Background

The October 2005 earthquake has had a devastating impact on human life and social infrastructure. The situation has been further exacerbated due to loss of assets. The catastrophe has affected all population groups, yet there is a variation in experience of women, men, boys, and girls.

As a consequence of this tragedy, vulnerable groups are now more at risk of becoming poorer. In particular, women-headed households¹, widows, and orphaned children, mostly girls, are reported by a number of stakeholders as having little access to supplies and services. Often the reason is limited mobility or absence of proper identity documents that could support them in making these claims.

Also as a result of the earthquake, in many instances, women's and men's roles have shifted. Women's roles have changed partly as a result of the loss of male partners, and their responsibilities have increased as they not only assume the additional burden of caring for orphaned children and persons with disabilities but are now also emerging as heads of households and decision makers.

As they take on these additional responsibilities, there is an even greater need for women to access economic and social opportunities (i.e. social protection, health, education, livelihood, WatSan, rural extension services, etc.), so that they can effectively care for their families and meet their traditional, as well as their emerging community and productive roles.

Consequently, for the recovery, reconstruction and rehabilitation efforts to be considered successful, our response to the disaster must be relevant to the needs, concerns and priorities of women and men, as well as girls and boys. The success in response requires the availability of data and information guiding future priorities, leading to their equal participation and access to socially valued goods, services and opportunities, resources and rewards.

Fairness in service provision and support can be maintained by paying attention to gender dimensions (i.e. Applying gender analysis and promoting use of sex disaggregated data) in reconstruction and rehabilitation related policies and programmes, yet requires still more systematic attention.

IV. Methodology

The concept of this inventory and gap analysis is based on the survey on services of interest to women and gender programming in the earthquake-affected areas, which was assigned by the ERRA Gender Team to ERRA-INFOCH on the occasion of International Women's Day on 08 March 2007. The information that was collected from the survey was unique in its form. This is the first time that an inventory of relevant projects, initiatives, and actors has been carried out. In order to disseminate the data, ERRA-INFOCH decided to restructure the information in the form of a Topical Report, in co-operation with the ERRA Gender Team.

The following steps have been adopted for the compilation of the report:

- The report template was drafted by ERRA-INFOCH according to the projected requirements of the various end-users, then edited and approved by the ERRA Gender Team.
- The previous data of the survey of services of interest to women and gender programming was collected from three different levels: district, zonal, and federal levels. All primary sources originate from government (i.e. Federal, provincial/State, and District levels), national and international organisations.
- The data collected through a rapid household gender assessment in March 2007 from a sample of 30 Union Councils in the affected districts was also taken into account.
- The data from the survey of services of interest to women and gender programming was combined from the above mentioned levels into one document and disaggregated by location according to the following affected places Muzaffarabad, Neelum, Bagh, Poonch (Rawalakot), Abbottabad, Mansehra, Balakot, Battagram, Kohistan, and Shangla.
- The second data disaggregation was made according to four of the six sectors identified as priority focus for gender mainstreaming, namely: Health, Education Social Protection, and Livelihood.
- The third set of data combines projects with a focus on gender programming on the advice of the ERRA Gender Team.
- After the disaggregation of the data by district and by sector, all information was sent back to the respective organisations and offices through the ERRA-INFOCH Zonal Offices for validation and update.
- ERRA-INFOCH requested experts in the relevant sectors of ERRA and other contributing organisations to provide an introduction and definition of the respective sectors in the context of this study, relating to services of interest to women and gender programming.
- The ERRA Gender Team reviewed and analysed both data set to identify areas that need further strengthening.

V. Sectors of Activity

A. Gender Programming and Women Specific Services²

An objective of gender mainstreaming is to achieve sustainable human development for all. In the context of the EQAA, this means that the opportunities and benefits of the reconstruction and rehabilitation efforts accrue to men, women, boys, and girls.

This then requires that both women and men be involved at all levels and have equal opportunities to influence policies, programmes and service delivery options, and to participate in public decision-making. However, given the position (women's social and economic standing relative to men) and condition of women in Pakistan, and in this instance in the EQAA, to ensure that they have access to equal opportunities and benefits, special measures must be put in place, particularly as the burden of poverty falls disproportionately on women. There is increasing empirical evidence supporting the notion of feminization of poverty, where women remain more vulnerable to social deprivation and injustice, with their access to resources, services and opportunities remaining dismally low in comparison to men. This situation is further aggravated in the face of conflict and natural disasters.

Yet, women want to have a say in shaping the decisions that affect their lives and the lives of their families, the political economy and future of their communities. Women's equal participation in shaping public policies, programmes, projects, and service delivery options and in decision-making is a necessary condition for women's interests and concerns to be taken into account, particularly as women have a different experience of life, and consequently different needs, interests and priorities.

Gender programming looks to empower both women and men, so they are able to take control over their lives: set their own agendas, gain skills, build self-confidence, solve problems, and develop self-reliance. It is not only a collective, social and political process, but an individual one as well, and it is not only a process but an outcome too. Outsiders cannot empower women: only women can empower themselves to make choices or to speak out on their own behalf. However, institutions, including international co-operation agencies and civil society organisations, can support processes that increase women's self-confidence, develop their self-reliance, and help them set their own agendas.

Women's empowerment also refers to the recognition that women legitimately have the ability and should, individually and collectively, participate effectively in decision-making processes that shape their societies and their own lives.

In brief, women's empowerment focuses on strategic interests; it is about women's sense of self-worth; their right to have and to determine choices; their right to have access to opportunities and resources; their right to have the power to control their own lives, both within and outside the home; and their ability to influence the direction of social change to create a more just social and economic order, locally, nationally, and internationally.

In the context of the EQ reconstruction and rehabilitation gender programming needs to address both the practical needs and strategic interests of all.

Practical needs tend to involve women as beneficiaries and perhaps as participants; can improve the condition (refers to women's material state) of women's lives; and generally does not alter roles and relationships. On the other hand, addressing strategic interests involves women as agents or enables women to become agents; can improve the position of women in society, that is women's social and economic standing relative to men, measured, for example by male/female disparities in wages and employment opportunities, participation in

decision-making bodies, vulnerability to violence, vulnerability to poverty, vulnerability to natural disasters; and can empower women and transform relationships.

Most projects currently underway in the EQAA address primarily women's practical needs, with a few, starting to address women's strategic interests. The inventory of programs and projects identified and currently underway therefore tend to have a focus on services of interest to women and girls.

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B. Health

The Alma Ata Conference (1978) strongly reaffirms that Health as defined by WHO³ which is “a state of complete physical, mental and social wellbeing, and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity, is a fundamental human right and that the attainment of the highest possible level of health is a most important world-wide social goal whose realization requires the action of many other social and economic sectors in addition to the health sector.”

In the earthquake affected areas, health does not refer just to the status of the population that is the threats of diseases they face, or those they are suffering from. It covers the range of services designed to promote Health and that includes “preventive, curative and palliative interventions, whether directed to individuals or to populations” thus aiming at prevention and adoption of practices that minimizes the risk of diseases to curative, that is addressing the specific illnesses and conditions people are suffering from. It encompasses the delivery of health services provided through the different levels of health facilities (Basic Health Units, Rural Health centres, hospitals etc...) as well as those at community level such as the work of the Lady Health works, community volunteers and vaccinators.

Please find below definitions of subcategories of activities in the field of health, as well as summaries of these activities in AJ&K and NWFP.

1. Reproductive Health / Population

WHO defines⁴ reproductive health as “a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity, in all matters relating to the reproductive system and to its functions and processes.” The concept of reproductive health, as an essential component of public health, has received increased attention and has been adopted in all countries where the WHO operates. Hence, the need for integrating the existing fragmented services into the national health care system is being further appreciated through a holistic approach to reproductive health care.

The Reproductive Health concept is centred on human needs and development throughout the life cycle. Reproductive health concepts include the well being of men, women and young people as concerns their reproductive functions throughout their life span. Issues emerging as priority areas in national reproductive health programmes in different countries, include: reproductive tract infections, sexually transmitted infections including HIV/AIDS, reproductive health in adolescence and post menopause, reproductive system cancers, harmful practices to reproductive health, premarital and genetic counselling and neonatal screening for inherited disorders etc. Reproductive health research impacts policy formation and

promotion, program design and implementation, efficiency and efficacy of the health service delivery system which is essential for the identification and adoption of best practices for PHC.

2. Awareness Raising and Training

According to WHO⁵, and in the context of a gender sensitive health policy and perspective, it becomes essential to translate knowledge into concrete actions for confronting health challenges and inequities faced by men and women and hence the need for advocacy and capacity building. Advocacy includes both awareness raising and sensitization where the former leads to a certain level of sensitization. Awareness raising is used to enhance individual, collective/ group and community knowledge on subjects of mutual interest such as health care and health services and delivery and more essentially how it impacts women and female adolescents. All health professionals must have knowledge and awareness of the ways gender affects health, so that they may address gender issues wherever appropriate and thus make their work more effective. The process of creating this knowledge and awareness of - and responsibility for - gender among all health professionals is called "gender mainstreaming".

Capacity building or training in health initiatives relates to increased knowledge and information, higher level of education and training relating to local, national and global health care issues. It involves imparting different forms and levels of knowledge and education to stake holders, partners, target groups and beneficiaries for increasing their effectiveness and efficacy to address relevant issues and manage subsequent programmes. Capacity building not merely generates information sharing and clarity but also forms a pioneer source of inculcating better management, administrative and sometimes leadership qualities within the beneficiaries. Tools for advocacy, awareness raising and training include technical support materials and curricula, resource kits, on-line training modules, and others documenting "best practices".

Management practices are important in all health care settings and strengthening the management capabilities of the health workforce, including both men and women is a critical strategy for improving the performance of health facilities and for building health systems. Current holistic development strategies have tried to absorb and interlink advocacy and capacity building to foster better strategic approach towards policy planning and programme implementation in multiple sectors including gender, health and development.

3. Maternal and Child Health Care - MCH

According to WHO⁶, MCH (Maternal and child health) relates to health issues confronting mothers, new born and children. As per one estimate more than half a million women die in pregnancy or childbirth, and more than 10 million children die each year before their fifth birthday - nearly 40% of these in the first month of life. In view of the high magnitude of maternal and neonatal death in some countries and the limited resources available in the

region, specific focus has been addressed to safe-motherhood related programmes, including antenatal, obstetric, postpartum and newborn health and family planning.

At the same time, and according to WHO, there is growing international consensus that investments in saving the lives of women and children have the potential to bring substantial, long-term development returns, not only to the lives of those who are vulnerable, but also to global and national economies. Millions of these lives can be saved each year with cost-effective, known interventions.

4. Primary Health Care

According to WHO⁷, a health system based on Primary Health Care focuses on improving the overall health of the population rather than just the treatment of disease. In terms of level of care, primary health care is the first point of contact for patients within an organized health care system which could be at the level of the health centre, the polyclinic or hospital ambulatory care. The original eight primary health care services considered essential in the joint WHO -UNICEF declaration of Alma Ata of 1978 include: immunization, health education, nutrition, safe water and basic sanitation, maternal and child health care including family planning, prevention and control of locally endemic diseases, appropriate treatment of common diseases and injuries and provision of essential drugs.

Primary Health Care became a core policy for WHO with the Declaration of Alma-Ata in 1978 and the subsequent development of the Global Strategy for health for all. Currently different names are given to the concept of primary health care, such as basic benefit package, core package and essential core services. The primary health care philosophy of universality, equity, quality, efficiency and sustainability was the basis of different models initiated throughout the world and created a conducive environment for many of the successful initiatives including a gender based perspective.

WHO's current focus on the diseases of the poor and work on health systems is consistent with the messages of primary health care for all including men, women and children of all ages.

C. Education

As ERRA recognizes in the "Reconstruction and Rehabilitation Strategy, Educational Sector; April 2006", more than 18,000 students and 853 teachers and staff lost their lives in NWFP and AJK as a direct consequence of the earthquake in 2005. Sixty seven (67%) percent of the total institutions in the 9 affected districts of AJK were either destroyed or damaged.⁸

In addition to the visible damage, the earthquake had a huge psychological impact on the communities of the affected districts, specially the children who were shattered and lost all motivation and confidence in themselves and their progress.⁹

ERRA acknowledges the fact that this challenge also offers an opportunity to fully provide educational facilities to all including those who did not have educational institutions before, especially for girls. There are more than 900 settlements in NWFP alone, where even primary education level facilities, mostly for girls, do not exist.¹⁰ Consequently, ERRA states that the new schools and upgrades included in the strategy will be mostly girls' schools.

This document covers the construction element of the fully damaged and partially destroyed educational facilities in the earthquake affected areas, while looking into the quality education aspects. While presenting the aforementioned, it is cognizant of the rehabilitation efforts vis-à-vis the formal and non - formal educational institutions, adult literacy initiatives, and school feeding initiatives of the NGOs and the Public Sector. The report lays special emphasis on the issues of gender dimension, and builds upon the elements of access, enabling environment, and sustainability in the education programming.

1. Formal and Non-Formal Education

In the context of this document, 'Formal Education' refers to a planned intervention by the state or society to transfer knowledge to its individuals by using class room, arranged and systematic syllabus and teachers.¹¹ 'Non-formal Education' refers to technical and vocational education, sports and recreational activities. In the earthquake-affected areas, non-formal education is considered to be a favourable way to promote gender equality, innovative ideas for out-of-school youth, and re-entry of youth to schools¹².

2. Adult Literacy

According to ERRA, Adult Literacy describes "any intervention to impart education to grown up individuals, whether formal or non- formal."¹³ This includes all "activities to promote the ability of adults to read, write, speak, compute and solve problems at the level of proficiency required on the job and in society. It also encompasses aspects of personal development, improving self-esteem and confidence building."¹⁴

3. Construction of Schools

ERRA has envisaged a two pronged strategy for the rehabilitation of the educational facilities in the nine earthquake affected districts of NWFP and AJK. The first and foremost are the reconstruction and rehabilitation of partially damaged and fully destroyed buildings of schools, colleges, vocational and technical institutions, and universities.

Secondly, news schools would be established based on community needs assessment, and with a deliberate focus on promoting girls education. Where appropriate, strategic integration,

and up-gradation of educational facilities would be carried out in line with ERRA vision of 'Build Back Better'¹⁵.

For all schools and educational institutions construction, the guiding principles are seismically resistant designs and stronger structures. These are to provide a safer place for children and teachers for better education and enhanced creativity, upgraded facilities inside the schools to provide an enabling learning environment, provision of adequate educational material, and teaching and learning aids.

Besides, critical elements that are to be considered are to ensure enhanced learning achievements, and improved ownership of the communities. This is suggested to be secured through their involvement in the processes of planning, operations, and management of the schools.

Recruitment and training of teaching staff and capacity building of the District Education Services are other support elements of the ERRA Education Sector Rehabilitation approach to make the reconstructed schools functional and more sustainable.

4. School Feeding Program

In the context of this document, "School Feeding" describes the school-based food distribution system intended to enhance the enrolment and attendance among school-age children, particularly girls. It intends to increase the attention and concentration of students in learning¹⁶. According to ERRA¹⁷, the initial programme has been supported by WFP in which quality dates, high energy biscuits and vegetable oil were distributed to school children.

D. Social Protection

According to ERRA, Social Protection Cell¹⁸, "Social Protection" can be broadly defined as "public actions, carried out by the state or privately, that enables people to deal more effectively with risk and their vulnerability to crisis and changes in circumstances and help tackle extreme and chronic poverty. However, too wide a definition can make it difficult to distinguish Social Protection from development policy more broadly. Many activities that tackle chronic poverty or help people deal with their vulnerability to crisis would not usually be regarded as Social Protection for instance flood defences to help communities deal with the risk of flooding and immunization to pre-empt disease among the chronically poor. Though these actions address vulnerabilities of people, they can hardly be classified as Social Protection."

According to ERRA, the vulnerabilities emanating from natural disasters merit separate set of remedial measures and public actions. The Social Protection programmes employed to address the risks and vulnerabilities of natural disaster stricken population have usually different dynamics and objectives. Such Social Protection programmes are specifically tailored to address the immediate needs and vulnerabilities of affected population with a view to effectively mitigating disaster impact and enable them to restore their life to pre disaster level.

In a region which had never before experienced devastation of this scale, over 73,000 people died, a similar number of people injured, and a huge surviving population remained that is vulnerable to a number of factors. The victims were mainly from already vulnerable groups, living in comparatively inaccessible mountain areas with lower levels of income and service provision as compared to the national average. The population and social structures of the earthquake hit areas have been seriously affected by the number of deaths.

According to ERRA, experience from similar disasters around the world has shown that vulnerable populations are often neglected in immediate aid interventions which generally entail search and rescue, food aid, emergency medical assistance, evacuation or the construction of temporary shelters. In the case of Pakistan, the vulnerability of individuals and families further increased due to difficult terrain, far-flung villages, a lack of equipment, inadequate transportation infrastructure, and a truly colossal amount of damage.

1. Legal Assistance

Legal Assistance, in the context of this document, refers to projects and programmes offering legal services in the earthquake-affected areas that are made available to persons unable to afford an attorney. According to ERRA, Planning Wing, Social Protection Cell¹⁹, a number of widows and orphans are feared to be in danger of losing their rightful share of lands/properties as a result of the damaged records and lack of access to appropriate revenue authorities.

2. Services for landless persons

The earthquake caused the physical disappearance of land due to landslides and flooding, resulting in a substantial population of vulnerable families deemed landless. Approximately 10,000 families are vulnerable due to loss of their land on which they had their home and now have no place to rebuild their houses. Verified figures from governments of AJK and NWFP suggest that the numbers of landless currently in camps are: 635 families in 44 camps and 188 families in 3 camps respectively. In addition the AJK government estimates landless outside of camps are 4,000. The numbers in NWFP have not yet been established.

3. Services for women-headed households /Widows

According to the data gathered by ERRA's Livelihood Cash Grant Programme²⁰; the number of families/households that are widow/women headed are approximately 55,172 and the number of individuals is 101,130.

The government has made special provisions for the most vulnerable groups, which include women headed households. NGOs have been encouraged to come and help these groups in housing reconstruction. Many such NGO Projects are currently underway.

4. Services for Orphans

According to ERRA, thousands of children lost their parents as a result of the EQ. The government recognizes that community or family based care is the best option for such children. But as a matter of policy, the government has kept the option of institutional care such as SOS Children's Villages to accommodate those cases where adequate and satisfactory family based care is not available.

E. Livelihood

In the context of this document, and according to a description provided by CARE International, livelihood is defined as “the capabilities, assets and activities required to earn a living. The major premise behind a livelihood improvement approach is that it must be rooted in the nascent energies of the people themselves; these energies have to be tapped, resourced and channelled. In short, livelihood improvement requires a process of empowerment which is based on individual and institutional capacity building.”²¹

Vocational training and Micro-financing activities in the earthquake affected area of Pakistan constitute viable steps for achieving these objectives.

1. Vocational Training

According to a recent definition by the International Labour Organisation (ILO), technical and vocational training in the context of this document is defined as “a programme aimed at applying the necessary knowledge and skill for specific occupation. Training may take place in schools, centres, workplace or in designated institutions, and “may be targeted to all individuals who are of age sixteen years or older, including university graduates, who want to change career or develop a skill.”²²

2. Microfinance

In this particular context, 'Microfinance' can be described in line with a recent definition by UNCDF²³ as "financial services targeting participants in the informal sector or those operating very small enterprises, particularly poor women." Services include loans for business purposes and other direct financial support to victims of the earthquake in October 2005.

3. Cash Grant Assistance

In order to mitigate the immediate suffering resulting from the devastation, and to assist people to regain their livelihoods, a US\$85 million World Bank funded Cash Grant programme was initiated by the GoP and ERRA. This was envisaged to provide immediate and interim assistance and replace income losses of the most vulnerable households. The cash grants helped affected people get back on their feet in a short time and provided much needed subsistence allowance. It also injected dearly required cash back into a devastated local economy thereby contributing to the revival of economic activity in earthquake-affected areas. The Cash Grant programme was designed to provide an interim livelihood capacity to the 250,000 most vulnerable families in the earthquake-affected districts. It was not intended as an ongoing or permanent welfare measure.

The decision to provide PKR 3,000 per month as a subsistence allowance was taken considering the average family size and local economy. Moreover, several national and international NGOs, governments and GoP were providing food, medicine and shelter packages, which were serving the immediate needs of earthquake-affected population. Moreover, cash had been disbursed in the local economy in terms of death and injury compensation as well as en-block compensation of PKR 25,000 per household for initial shelter needs.

As per design, the programme was implemented in all the nine earthquake-affected districts of AJK and NWFP. Coverage and geographic targeting was agreed with the mutual consent of ERRA and District Offices. As a general formula, the entire Union Council having 10 or more deaths in the earthquake-affected districts of NWFP and AJK were selected for the program. The program was implemented in phases, starting from Muzaffarabad and Mansehra. Initially, the eligibility criteria for the beneficiaries were defined only to the extent of registration. However, final eligibility criteria was developed after running the pilot in Muzaffarabad and Mansehra, and doing an extensive simulation²⁴ exercise with the data, thus earmarking the available funds in a standardized manner. The final criteria so evolved and approved were:

- Status of house destroyed or damaged; and does not have any current government employee of grade 17 or above, and
- A family headed by a female, and currently not married (widow, divorced, separated, never married)

- OR has at least one disabled person
- OR has five or more children (including other's orphans)

The amount of cash grant was decided as PKR 3,000 per month for a period of six months. Hence, an amount of Rs. 18,000 was to be distributed in six equal monthly instalments. The final date for completion was set as June 2007.²⁵ Approximately 260,000 out of 740,000 applications have received PKR 3,000 in 6 instalments. During the inception of cash grant program, a provision for the extension of cash grant for the most vulnerable group was provided.

After the completion of detailed survey of vulnerable population, it was decided to extend the cash grant programme by an additional six months for extremely vulnerable groups, namely women headed families, while other more sustainable livelihood options and opportunities are identified. New eligibility criteria were developed and the cash grant was extended to a total of approx 22,000 families:

- Families headed by woman, and having disabled and 5 or more children;
- Families headed by woman, and having 5 or more children;
- Families headed by woman, and taking care of orphans;
- Families headed by woman, and having disabled members.

VI. Coverage by District

A. Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJ&K)

1. Muzaffarabad

Muzaffarabad is the capital of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK). The district of Muzaffarabad is located on the banks of the Jhelum and Neelum rivers and covers a mountainous area. The district is bounded by Punjab Province in the west, by the Kupwara and Baramulla districts of Indian-controlled Jammu and Kashmir in the east, and the Federally Administered Northern Areas (FANA) in the north. The population of the district, according to the 1998 Census, was 725, 000. The district comprises three Tehsils, and the city of Muzaffarabad serves as the capital of Azad Jammu and Kashmir.

Muzaffarabad was the epicentre of the 2005 Kashmir earthquake, which occurred on October 8, 2005 and had a magnitude of 7.6. The earthquake destroyed 50% of the buildings in the city (including most of the official buildings) and is estimated to have killed a total number of 74,000 people in the Pakistani-controlled areas of Kashmir and NWFP.

2. Neelum

Neelum district spreads over the Neelum Valley, which is 144 km long and is bow-shaped, filled with majestic pine, fir and deodar trees. It lies north-south of Muzaffarabad (capital of AJ&K). The valley is divided by the Neelum River which flows in serpentine down hill to merge itself into the river Jhelum at Domail. The geographical features of the Neelum valley enhance the natural attraction of the area. Its elevation, a mere 600 meters at the start, gradually rises till it attains a height of 2,425 meters. On both the sides there are high mountains and peaks. Nearly all the forest wealth of Azad Kashmir is found in this valley. There are two approaches to the valley; one from Kaghan valley and other from Muzaffarabad, the capital of AJ&K.

District Neelum suffered less damage from the earthquake 2005, in comparison to the neighbouring District Muzaffarabad. But due to the relatively underdeveloped communication facilities (in particular the substandard road network), district Neelum appears disadvantaged in terms of international and national relief efforts.

3. Bagh

Bagh City, the headquarters of district Bagh is located 100 km south-east of Muzaffarabad (via Kohala) 80 km via Suddhen Gali, 205 km north-east of Islamabad and 48 km north of Rawalakot. This town is situated on the confluence of two smaller nullahs - Malwani and Mall, which carry water all the year around. The "Haji Peer Pass" is about 32 km from Bagh City, linked with metalled road. Middle standard hotels, PWD and Forest rest houses are available for visitors, whereas all basic necessities of life are available in the Bagh bazaars.

4. Poonch

Rawalakot is a small size city and the capital of the Poonch District of Azad Jammu and Kashmir. It is in a saucer-shaped valley at elevation 1,615 meters (5,300 ft). It is 76 km (47 miles) away from Kohala, and is linked with Rawalpindi and Islamabad via the neighbouring Tehsils of Azad Pattan and Dhirkot (district Bagh), and with Muzaffarabad via Kohala and Sudhangali by asphalt roads.

B. North Western Frontier Province (NWFP)

1. Abbottabad

Abbottabad, the bordering district of NWFP with Punjab, is most scenic and prosperous, thus remains an attraction for the tourists. It did not suffer significant losses comparatively in the earthquake of 2005. Abbottabad is the principal city of the District. It is located at 100 km (75 miles) north of the capital Islamabad and 205 km north-east from Peshawar, at an altitude of 4,120 feet (1,250 meters) above the sea level. The city is located in a valley and is known for its pleasant weather, its multitude of educational institutions of high standard and the military training establishments.

2. Mansehra

The district of Mansehra is located between 34° – 14' and 35° – 11' north latitudes and 72° – 49' and 74° – 08' east longitude. It borders in the north with Battagram and Kohistan districts, in the east by Muzaffarabad district of Azad Jammu and Kashmir, in the south by Abbottabad and Haripur districts and in the west by Swat district.

The distinct features of the district are its mountain ranges, the plains, valleys and the lakes. The area is characterized by its rich and harmonious combination of tall and stately fine trees, high mountains, plains, scenic valleys and lakes.

3. Balakot

Balakot, the Tehsil headquarters, is located about thirty kilometres from the city of Mansehra (district capital, see also section V.B.1). It is a famous tourist destination of the region and used to be the first stop for tourists who wish to visit the secluded Kaghan valley in the North-West Frontier Province of Pakistan. The river Kunhar runs through the city. Balakot serves as the chief city of Balakot Tehsil and is surrounded by many smaller towns and villages.

The Balakot town was completely destroyed in the massive 2005 earthquake on 8 October 2005. The main Balakot city is located in a seismic “Red Zone” (earthquake high risk area) where reconstruction is not permitted by the Federal Government. The Government decided to relocate Balakot at Bakriyal, 25 km in the west from existing Balakot town, under the name of “New Balakot City”.

4. Battagram

Battagram district is located at latitude 34o-40 and longitude 73o-1, surrounded by Kohistan district to the north, Mansehra district to the east, Kala Dhaka tribal area to the south and Shangla district of Malakand division to the west. Its headquarters is at Battagram town at a distance of about 75 km from Mansehra on the Karakorum Highway. The district consists of Battagram and Allai sub-divisions.

The district is mostly mountains with peaks rising above 4,000 meters with thick forests. However, fertile plain areas exist in Nindhyar, Tikri, Deshan, Batamori, Banna and Rashang valleys. The highest point is Darwazai Sar (4,689 meters). The next highest point is in the central part of the district, with an altitude of about 3,000 meters. From the central mountains, various spurs and hills of lesser height run in various directions.

5. Shangla

Shangla, a district in the North-West Frontier Province of Pakistan, with its district headquarters in Alpurai, has five Tehsils namely Alpurai, Besham, Chakesar, Martung and Puran. Shangla has the lowest Human Development Index in the province. Shangla was previously a subdivision of Swat district and was given the status of a district on 01 July 1995. Shangla Pass (Shangla top), which separates the district from Swat, is the particular way of communication between the two districts.

The district borders on the east by Provincial Administered Tribal Area(PATA) district of Battagram and Tehsil Kala Dhaka along which the Indus river flows for about 75 km, in the west by district Swat, in the south by district Buner and tribal area of Kala Dhaka and in the north by district Kohistan.

The total area of the district is 1,586 square kilometres. Shangla district consists of small valleys surrounded by high mountains, full of forests comprising Pindrow Fir, Morinda Spruce, Blue Pine (Kail), Chir Pine and Deodar (Cedar) trees. The general elevation of the district is 2,000 to 3,000 meters above sea level. There are beautiful isolated valleys most suitable for seed production of highly demanded cross-pollinated vegetable crops. Moreover Shangla has got a tremendous potential for hydro power generation - one of such projects is currently under construction at Khan Khwar in Union Council Shang.

The total population of the district is 512,000 with an annual average growth rate of 3.27% and population density of 274 persons per square kilometre. The total number of households is 64,391 with an average household size of 8.

6. Kohistan

Kohistan is a sparsely populated district in the North-West Frontier Province of Pakistan that stretches from its border with Azad Jammu and Kashmir in the east, to Afghanistan's Nuristan province in the west. It is geographically located in an area where the Eurasian land plate and Indian subcontinent meet and collide; Kohistan is susceptible to earthquakes such as the earthquake of 2005.

District Kohistan is divided into three Tehsils namely Palas, Pattan and Dasso. The capital of Kohistan is Dasso. The word 'Kohistan; literally means 'land of mountains' and is one of the most isolated and the most deprived district not just in Hazara Division but in the entire North West Frontier Province (NWFP). Swat is situated to its west, Chilas, Darial and Tangir on the northern side and Naran, Kaghan and Alai valleys surround Kohistan from the southern and eastern sides. It is located in the heart of the Himalayas from 34.40 to 30.35 degrees latitude and from 75.30 to 50.72 degrees longitude. The total area of the District is 7,492 km².

VII. Summary and Gap-Analysis

A Rapid Household Assessment conducted in March 2007, in a sample of 30 Union Councils of the 9 EQAA, has highlighted the fact that generally speaking men and women have different access to resources, particularly financial and banking services, as well as information. This combined with the limited physical and social mobility of women as compared to men, further constrains women's ability to make informed decisions, care for their families, and absorb and recover from shocks such as the earthquake.

A. Findings

As shown in the tables below, there are variations in the level of access to resources by men and women between AJK and NWFP, as well as between men and women in both AJK and NWFP, with the data suggesting that the situation is more acute in terms of gender differential in NWFP. Of note is the percentage of respondents who are male in NWFP (95%) as compared to AJK (70%), which may be in part a reflection of socio-cultural patterns and in part a result of the interview methodology. Experience does tell us that to get women's views, inclusion of women in field survey teams is critical, as is the necessity to meet with women individually or as a group, and in the absence of men.

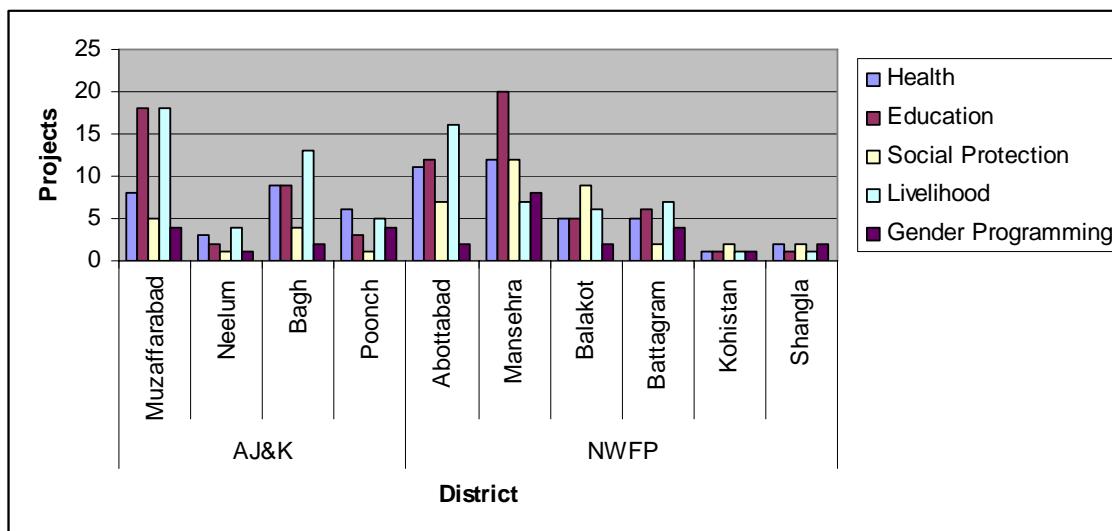

This data is further confirmed by the nature and extent of coverage of current projects that have a gender focus or in most instances provide services meeting basic and practical needs of women and children, as illustrated in the graphs below.

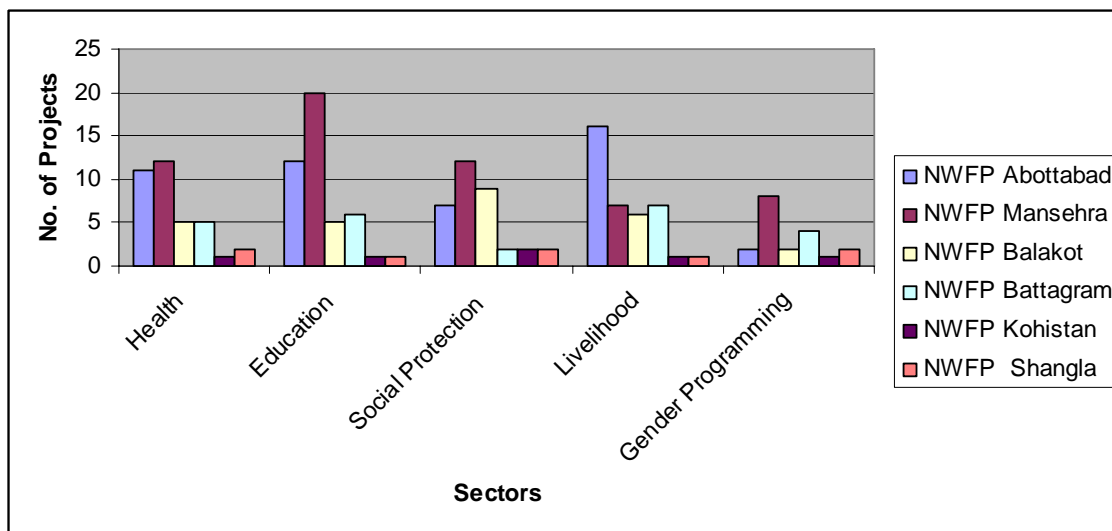
Chart 1: District-wise Services of Interest to Women/Gender Programming

The data gathered through the mapping process highlights that in NWFP, Government and NGOs are delivering a number of primary health care, reproductive, mother and child health services, along with awareness building initiatives in hygiene and sanitation. However the coverage of districts is quite uneven. While Abbotabad and Mansehra have several initiatives addressing practical needs of women and girls, these services are very limited in Battagram, Shangla and Kohistan. The same can be said for the delivery of education projects implemented by the Government and NGOs, whether these are in formal/non-formal education, adult literacy, or school feeding programs. Of special note however is the decision by ERRA to build new girls schools in Shangla and Kohistan.

Chart 2: Services available in Districts of NWFP

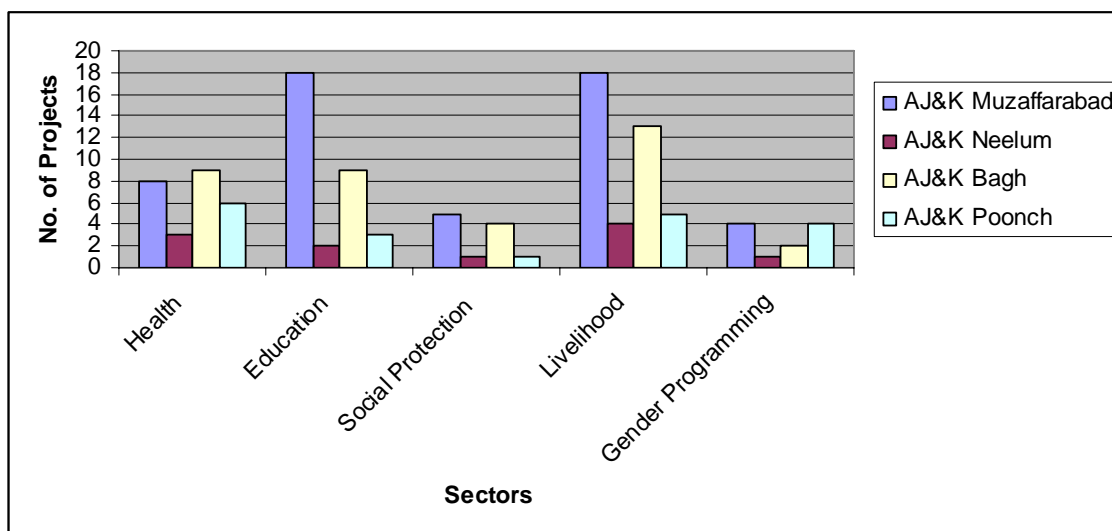

A similar pattern of geographical coverage is also evident in projects related to social protection, livelihood and gender programming. While there are projects addressing the legal, economic, social and political needs and interests of women and vulnerable group members in the EQAA of Mansehra, Abbottabad, and to a lesser extent Battagram, related services and technical assistance tend to be very limited in Shangla and Kohistan. The data gathered through the survey also brings out what appears to be an absence of services for orphan girls and boys and the elderly.

In AJK, the data highlights that Government and NGOs are delivering a number of primary health care, reproductive, mother and child health services, along with awareness building initiatives in hygiene and sanitation. However the coverage of districts is also quite uneven. While Bagh and Muzaffarabad have a number of initiatives addressing practical needs of women and girls, these services are fewer in Poonch (Rawalakot) and Neelum. The delivery of education projects implemented by the Government and NGOs, whether these are in formal/non-formal education, adult literacy, or school feeding programs follow a similar pattern and are much greater in Muzaffarabad and Bagh.

This is also evident in projects related to livelihood, with a significant number of initiatives being implemented in Muzaffarabad and Bagh, and just a very few in Neelum and Poonch (Rawalakot). In contrast to NWFP, there are very few projects related to social protection, addressing the legal, social needs and interests, as well as vulnerability and risks factors of women and vulnerable group members, being implemented in AJK affected districts. The data gathered through the survey also brings out what appears to be an absence of services for the elderly.

B. Conclusions

As mentioned at the outset, the situation in the affected areas is no different than in other parts of the country where societal norms perceive women primarily in a care giver role and also as passive recipients of support services. Yet, there is a growing recognition among different actors to evolve strategies to reduce disparity and inequality by attaching importance to the participation of women specially and of other vulnerable population groups so that initiatives are needs oriented, of a participatory nature and carry elements of sustainability.

Based on their past experiences and organizational methodologies diverse response programmes and projects are being implemented by governments, international and non-governmental organisations, which hold great relevance and promise.

However, in reviewing the list of programmes and projects, it becomes clear that in order to achieve fairness, social and economic opportunities and benefits have to be promoted. Advocacy is also required for designing and implementing programmes and projects that will improve decision making patterns, access to and control over resources, as few projects address strategic interests of affectees, particularly women's and girls. In addition, based on the number of projects implemented in the EQAA listed in the table on the previous page, it is clear that **disparities in programme and project implementation and service delivery, between and among districts, need to be examined and efforts made to redress the situation, particularly in Kohistan, Shangla, and Neelum.**

The other important facet that calls attention is the need to link voices of women and men from different levels to the reconstruction process so that there is effectiveness and relevance in conceived programmes and actions.

In light of the above, it will be important to organize information sessions at the district level where the findings of the survey on services of interest to women and gender programming can be disseminated, along with the Gender Policy for the EQAA. Such a session could be helpful in setting-up local networks on gender and reconstruction, a forum to exchange experiences and information at the district level, with a view of strengthening capacity to mainstream gender in project implementation, while also informing discussions of the ERRA Gender Core Group.

Such a local network would also be a mechanism to foster sharing of information and experiences among implementing organisations on project approaches adopted – what has been successful and what did not work. This process could also lead to collaboration between and among partners that will contribute in conceiving holistic demand driven gender sensitive initiatives.

It will also be essential to foster ongoing dialogue in communities with different groups, using such evidence from the ground, in order to build a greater understanding and acknowledgment of the reality and the productive contributions of all members of society, with particular attention to women's contributions.

The findings of the survey further suggest that there is a need for translating gender awareness into practice. Achieving gender equality will require:

- Building a common understanding among key stakeholders, program/project planners, designers and implementers on the concept and benefits of gender equality and gender mainstreaming
- Strengthening capacity of partner organizations, institutions, and government departments to promote, design and implement policies, programs and projects which reflect the needs, priorities and interests of both women and men, and support gender equality. This will include strengthening gender related capacity and skills for conducting gender analysis and planning.
- Designing specific measures to address gender inequalities and taking into account the needs, concerns, priorities and interests of women, men, boys and girls, including those of working women; this will require designing additional programmes and projects that address these, particularly in areas where fewer interventions are taking place, such as in Kohistan, Shangla, Neelum (e.g. health, education, social protection and livelihoods), as well as in Poonch, Balakot, Battagram (e.g. education and social protection).
- Initiating additional context specific projects addressing immediate and long term needs of women and girls, including at least one project addressing women's economic empowerment in each district.
- Adopting complementary approaches towards reducing disparities through targeted actions and a mainstreaming approach.
- Ensuring coordination among all actors/stakeholders: An array of grassroots, national, regional and international organizations/agencies responded to the catastrophe that took place on October 8, 2005 in parts of NWFP and AJK and this is clearly reflected in the programs and projects that were inventoried from the survey. At this stage of implementation however it becomes important to facilitate sharing of experience, identifying challenges and response strategies to overcome these. It is deemed important to establish linkages among organizations in order to draw lessons and to inform and adopt better reconstruction and rehabilitation policies. A district level network can serve as an alternate sharing mechanism providing a 'space' in which women and men from different organizations/sectors/regions can learn from each other. Sharing and understanding of issues faced by them will not only inform the organisational strategies and activities but at some point can also influence decision makers, policy makers, program planners and implementers
- Capitalizing on policy space made available especially in NWFP in the form of district resource centres run by the GOP. Such opportunities have to be seized by CSOs as the basis for constructive engagement for future collaboration between the public sector and civil society.
- Attracting and retaining human resources through policy actions need to be in place, including incentives and facilities that can attract women service providers to work in hard to reach and distant districts.
- Designing, implementing and monitoring programmes and projects in close collaboration with concerned line departments to ensure relevance and sustainability of results.
- The presence of Gender Coordinators within PERRA, SERRA, and District Reconstruction Units should assist in moving these actions forward, while also gathering more information about the identified and newly established programs and projects.

Finally, the next study to assess the level of services of interest to women and gender programming, should gather information on the scope (i.e. financial, geographical), the reach (i.e. number of direct program/project beneficiaries), and change in the condition and position of affectees as a result of the presence and implementation of a given programme/project.
